JANUARY MONTHLY REPORT

- 01/01 A Magnolia resident reports having cash stolen from his apartment after a New Years Eve party at his house.
- 01/01 The Papa Johns on Fairport Road was robbed when it opened for business on New Years day. The Clerks were ordered at gunpoint to put the cash in a pizza box. The suspect fled westbound on foot. The investigation is continuing.
- 01/02 A North Lincoln Road resident reported that her house was egged overnight.
- 01/03 A West Elm street man was charged with Menacing 2nd, Endangering the Welfare of a Child, and Harassment when a domestic dispute erupted into the female being threatened with a loaded shot gun. The gun was left readily accessible to the children. Four guns were removed from the house for safety.
- 01/03 A resident of Oak Street reported a burglary to his home business, when he woke up in the morning and discovered his mounted moose head was missing. Also taken was a tanned cow hide. No signs of forced entry.
- 01/04 A phone call from a Main Street bar regarding an unruly customer resulted in a DWI arrest after he left the bar and drove away. He was also charged with numerous other Vehicle and Traffic infractions after he refused to stop, and finally ended up in line behind other vehicles.
- 01/05 An East Rochester man was arrested for Burglary 2nd, and Criminal Mischief 4th after he kicked in his girlfriends door and entered her dwelling and kicked over her Xmas tree.
- 01/06 A routine traffic stop resulted in an arrest for False Personation, when the driver identified himself with a different date of birth. A person with the same name and a different birthday was wanted on two different arrest warrants. He was identified through other paperwork he produced as the wanted person, and was turned over to the other agencies.
- 01/07 An East Rochester man was arrested on twp separate counts of Criminal Contempt 2nd, and 1 count of Harassment, when he violated and order of protection his x girlfriend had against him. He was remanded to the county jail in lei of \$5,000.00 bail.
- 01/09 Two young girls were walking in the area of Despatch Drive and N.Washington St were surprised by a man who leapt from behind a tree, and opened his coat to reveal he was naked. They ran home and reported the event to their parents. Police searched the area with negative results.
- 01/09 A clerk standing in front of the Sunoco station on S. Washington Street was accosted by a customer who slapped him in the face. The clerk got the license plate number as the suspect drove away. The suspect was taken into custody later and charged with Harassment 2nd.
- 01/11 A woman reported her wallet stolen from the front seat of her car, while she was parked at the Piano Works Mall.
- 01/12 An East Rochester man was arrested for Harassment after he got into an argument with another tenant over a TV that was too loud. He punched the victim in the face. An order of Protection was issued for the victim. The suspect was transported to the county jail.

- 01/12 The East Rochester Techniplex Mall reported damage to the flood lights on the North side of the building. No witnesses.
- 1/16 While doing a traffic detail, ERPD did stop a vehicle for speeding. It was determined that the driver did have a suspended license. He was given 2 traffic tickets and released.
- 1/19 The same man that was a victim of the ongoing multi residential apartment neighbor trouble (1/12/09) got punched in the face by another neighbor. This time it happened over an argument about the mini blinds. There was a visible laceration and swelling above the victim's eye so the suspect was arrested for Assault 3rd and taken to MCJ.
- 1/19 An E. Filbert Street couple had been letting an acquaintance stay with them since Sept, 09. They had asked the acquaintance to return their vehicle. The keys to vehicle had been removed by the acquaintance without permission. There was an exchange of words and the acquaintance ended the conversation with a threat. The victim then called Rochester Police Department and the vehicle was located in Rochester. The stereo of the vehicle had been removed and causing damage. East Rochester PD was still investigating the incident when the owner of the vehicle called because the acquaintance was hiding in the couples garage on E. Filbert St. The acquaintance was located by there. He was arrested for Grand Larceny, Criminal Mischief 4th and Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle.
- 1/20 An intoxicated Garfield Ave. resident was arrested for harassment after threatening to kill his mother and break all the windows in her house. He then went to his girlfriend's apartment in E. Rochester where an emotional altercation ensued and he ran away threatening to kill himself by lying on the Railroad tracts. ERPD caught him hiding behind a garage and he was arrested for the harassment. An Order Of Protection was issued to the Mother and her husband.
- 1/20 Three victims in one day reported their vehicles had been entered and misc. items stolen from change to a \$10.00 lottery ticket. One vehicle was at a Main Street Business and the other two were at our Woodbine Ave. School parking lot. An eye witness at the business was able to describe the Fairport resident and East Rochester Police caught him in the Parking lot. He was charged with Petit Larceny.
- 01/22 After a near miss with an East Rochester Police vehicle, a traffic stop netted an arrest for Driving While Intoxicated and Driving without a license, Failure to Yield the right of way, and several more traffic infractions.
- 01/25 A West Spruce street resident reports that someone slashed the front tire of his car while parked in the driveway overnight.

The East Rochester Police responded to 1,241 calls in January. There were 22 arrests, but one suspect was arrested 5 times for continuous harassment, and violations of an order of protection. They assisted with 32 ambulance calls, and 11 fire calls. The Monroe County Sheriffs Department assisted us in the arrest of an armed robber at The Country Club Burger King. The suspect was indicted by a Grand Jury on 27 counts of Robbery 2nd, including our Burger King, and Papa Johns robbery. He faces life in prison.

Four Drop-In Story Times for ages 2-4 included 39 participants, and three Drop-In Story Times for ages 5-7 included 30 participants.
