

Public Hearing on Local Law #5 of 2012 closed at 8:15 pm.







I am pleased to report the following activity for the East Rochester Fire Department during the month of June;

- We answered (37) alarms for the month of June. Our year to date alarm total is (194) .
- In addition to our own alarms, we provided equipment and manpower for (2) mutual aid calls to the Fairport Fire Department for structure fire related incidents.
- So far this year, we have received the "Best Appearing" award at the Mendon Fire Department parade and at the Barnard Fire Department parade. These two parades have been the only ones that we've participated in so far this season and we have more to come. I am very proud of this fine group of volunteers and we will continue to represent East Rochester with pride in everything we do.
- I would like to remind everyone that our Firemen's Field Days will start on Wednesday July 25th and run through Saturday July 28th. We are looking forward to a successful and fun event this year and encourage everyone to stop by and support the East Rochester Fire Department.
- Pre-sale carnival ride tickets are available at the village office for anyone wishing to get their tickets early. The price for the pre-sale tickets are \$12.00 for (10) ride tickets. There will also be Pay-One-Price ride specials available at the carnival grounds through the event.

JUNE 2012

06/01 A William Street resident removed the top to his Jeep, and left it in his front yard. The resident discovered the top had been stolen sometime overnight.

06/02 A North Lincoln Road resident reported that someone removed his GPS, phone charger and sunglasses from his unlocked car overnight.

06/02 While doing her laundry at the Laundromat on West Commercial Street, a customer discovered that her wallet was stolen from her clothes pile.

06/02 A Linden Avenue resident reported a suspicious vehicle parked in the woods behind her house. The police arrived and discovered a car parked in the woods, not far from a tent that had been set up. Inside the tent was a male suspect that advised the officers that the car belong to a client. The tent was searched and several plastic baggies containing Heroin, and Hypodermic needles were discovered. The suspect was charged with Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance 7th, and Criminal Possession of Hypodermic Instruments. The vehicle's owner was contacted and retrieved his car.

06/03 An East Elm Street resident reported that during the daytime, someone entered his front porch and removed a bag of recycled bottles. He was spotted by the owner and dropped the bag and ran away. The owner had video surveillance of the porch area, and showed the tapes to our officers. The suspect is known, and was subsequently brought in and charged with Burglary3rd, and Attempted Petit Larceny. He was arraigned in front of a judge and sent to jail.

06/04 A west Commercial Street resident was charged with Public Intoxication under the Village Ordinance.

06/04 While on running radar on Fairport Road, an officer observed a vehicle going 58 MPH in a 40 zone. The vehicle was pulled over and it was determined that the driver was intoxicated. She was charged with two counts of Speeding in a Zone, No Seatbelt, and Driving while Intoxicated.

06/04 A car service center on Linden Avenue reported that someone removed the rear tire from a customer's car overnight, and left the vehicle up on a concrete block.

06/06 An East Chestnut Street resident reported that 4 of his video games were removed from his house, while he was out. The games were then cashed in to Game Stop on Panorama Trail. The store recorded who turned them in, and two suspects were arrested for the crime. One suspect was charged with Petit Larceny, and the second suspect was charged with Criminal Possession of Stolen Property 5th.

06/09 Three East Rochester youths were arrested under the Curfew law and returned to their parents. They were issued appearance tickets to Court.

06/09 A domestic dispute resulted in the male being arrested for Criminal Obstruction of Breathing, he was remanded to the Monroe County Jail and an Order of Protection was issued to the victim.

06/10 Police responded to a domestic dispute of parents versus an adult son. The suspect did display a knife to police officers and his parents. He was finally talked down, and was taken to the hospital voluntarily.

06/10 An East Commercial Street resident reported that someone smashed out the rear window out of his car which was parked in the driveway overnight.

06/12 An East Rochester resident was arrested for trespass after he was stopped while walking on the rail road tracks. He was issued an appearance ticket.

06/14 A 16 year old East Rochester resident was charged under the Curfew Law for being on the streets after midnight. She was issued an appearance ticket.

06/15 An East Rochester man was chased by an aggressive pit bull mix near the 500 block of West Commercial Street. The man defended himself from the dog but did receive several abrasion from a fall. Animal Control is investigating.

06/15 Two East Rochester youths were ticketed for having a loud car stereo in two separate cars. They were issued an appearance tickets under the Village Ordinance.

06/15 A Pittsford resident was also issued an appearance for a loud car stereo.

06/16 Police responded to a fight in progress call between two males on West Commercial Street. Upon arrival the officers observed that one of the males was attempting to stab the other with a knife. He was taken into custody and a knife was found near his person. He was charged with Menacing 2nd, and remanded to the Monroe County Jail. The knife was taken into evidence.

06/17 An East Rochester resident was arrested for Public Intoxication after causing a disturbance on East Maple Avenue at 2:00 in the morning .

06/18 A Rochester resident was charged with leaving the Scene of an Accident, Unlicensed Operator, and No Seat Belt. He side swiped several cars on Milrace Drive, and an observant neighbor got a plate number and vehicle description. The vehicle was found several streets away and the driver was admitted to the accident.

06/19 Two bicycles were stolen from the High School during the school day. No witnesses.

06/20 An East Rochester youth was arrested under the Curfew Law and taken home to his parents with an appearance ticket to East Rochester Court.

06/21 A domestic involving boyfriend/girlfriend resulted in the male being arrested for Assault 3rd, when the female showed the officer s bruised on her arms and legs. He was ordered to jail on 500.00 bail.

06/22 A Drumore Cresent resident returned home to find her neighbor standing in her basement going through cd's. Also missing from the house were an X-box, a lap top computer, and several cartons of cigarettes. The neighbor stated she only came in to check on the cats. She was charged with Criminal trespass.

06/23 Police responded to a Hit and run accident on South Lincoln Road. A description of the vehicle and driver was broadcast, and a license plate number was observed. The vehicle was stopped further down S Lincoln Rd, and the driver was intoxicated. He was charged with Leaving the Scene of an Accident, Driving While intoxicated, No insurance, Unregistered Motor Vehicle, and a Suspended Registration,

06/24 A Garfield Street resident reported that her x boyfriend appeared at her window with a knife, and threatened her. When she refused to come out of the house-he slashed her front tire. A description of the suspect was broadcast, and he was picked up several houses down. The knife was found near him on the sidewalk. The female positively identified him, and he was charged with Menacing 2nd, and Criminal Mischief 4th. He was remanded to the jail on 5,000.00 bail, and an order of Protection was issued for the victim.

06/25 A West Ivy Street resident reported that a chair had been stolen from his Patio set.

06/27 A Magnolia Avenue resident reported that her two bikes were stolen from the outside of her apartment overnight.

06/28 Police responded to a report of a fight on South Washington Street. Upon arrival two female s were seen arguing, and one was bleeding. The suspect was charged with Harrasment 2nd, and issued an appearance ticket; the victim was transported to the hospital. Police took the suspect home. Upon arrival at the home of the suspect her mother became irate at the the officers for arresting her daughter. She became loud and verbally abusive to the officers, and was placed under arrest for Disorderly Conduct. She fought with the officers and was also charged with Harassment, and Resisting arrest. She was arraigned in front of a judge, and sent to the Monroe County Jail.

06/29 An Oak Street resident reported that someone kicked in the garage door panel and removed a chainsaw, and a trailer jack from his garage. No witnesses.

There were 961 service calls from the 911 center in June. There were 100 traffic tickets written, and three DWI's. There were five Curfew arrests, three Excessive Noise arrests, and three for Public Intoxication under the Village Ordinance. The Police took 520 self- initiated calls, and did building and house checks for commercial and vacant property, and residents on vacation. The Chief of Police asks all residents to keep an eye out for our children who will be walking up to the high school to use the swimming pool, since the outdoor pool is closed for re-construction.
