DECEMBER 2010

- 12/01 A former Garfield Street resident reported that while she was in the process of moving, some of her tools and bikes were left in the backyard shed. The new tenant moved in and put the items outside the shed in the yard. Upon returning to retrieve the rest of her property she discovered that they had been stolen. No witnesses.
- 12/02 An East Maple Avenue resident reported that someone forced open the door to his apartment and removed an X box and six assorted video games. Nothing else of value was removed from the apartment.
- 12/03 A Pine Street resident reported that she observed a vehicle pull up in front of her house, and someone threw a brick smashing in her front picture window, then drove away. The brick has been identified as one of her acquaintances, and the investigation will continue.
- 12/03 A West Elm Street female reported from the hospital that her boyfriend had slapped her and punched her. She has an order of protection against him. He was arrested and sent to the Monroe County jail, where he continued to call her multiple times. The jail was notified of the situation and banned him from the phone. He was charged with Harassment 2nd, and Criminal Contempt 1st.
- 12/05 Police responded to a medical 500 on West Filbert Street. Upon arrival of the medical examiner, the victim was pronounced dead. Next of kin was notified.
- 12/07 A Magnolia Avenue resident reported she had a table for sale on Craig's list. She received three money orders for 950.00 which the buyer said he sent to her in error. He wanted her to deposit them in her checking account and send him the difference. She became suspicious and was notified by her bank they were forgeries. She lost no money and continues to advertise on Craig's list.
- 12/07 A Linen Avenue female reported that her 15 year old daughter had left home and was living at a friends house on E Elm Street. The mother tried to get her to return home. Child Protective was notified of the situation. They are investigating possible neglect on the mother's part.
- 12/09 A routine traffic stop yielded an arrest for Unlawful Possession of Marijuana. The vehicle was uninsured and had a suspended registration, traffic tickets were issued for thee infractions.
- 12/10 A customer of Red Apple on North Washington Street reported losing his wallet. He was called by the store and told someone had turned his wallet in. The wallet was returned but contained no cash.
- 12/11 A West Maple avenue resident reported that her car was keyed by an unknown suspect overnight.

- 12/11 While in the process of investigating a hit and run motor vehicle accident, the runaway vehicle was found on West Elm Street. Upon questioning the driver, he gave a false name and began to pretend that he was having a seizure. He threw himself to the ground and refused to be handcuffed. While being placed in the patrol car, he began to kick and bang his head against the door of the patrol vehicle. An ambulance responded, and the ambulance crew transported the man to the hospital under the Mental Hygiene law. He was later arrested after being released from the hospital for False Personation, and Criminal Mischief 3rd. There was over \$800.00 worth of damage to the Police Vehicle.
- 12/13 A domestic dispute on Linden Avenue resulted in the female half being arrested for Harassment after she pushed the police officer who had responded. She was charged with Harassment 2nd.
- 12/13 An East Chestnut resident reported her home had been burglarized and two flat screen televisions and a laptop were removed. The front door was unlocked. No signs of forced entry. The neighbors are being canvassed.
- 12/15 A domestic dispute between two brothers resulted in one of them being arrested for Harassment after he threatened to kill him. An arrest was made for Harassment and an order of protection was issued.
- 12/16 Wegmans employees reported that a woman who came into the pharmacy with several children, and shortly after she began beating one of the kids. The woman left the store, and an employee got her license plate number and reported her to the police. Child Protectives will follow up with the case.
- 12/20 A merchant on West Commercial Street reported that someone was using his likeness on Craigs List, and calling him a crook. The report is under investigation.
- 12/22 An East Chestnut Street resident reported cash missing from an envelope in his desk. No other items were taken from the house. The neighborhood was canvassed with negative results.
- 12/22 While trying to resolve a parking problem at the Montessori School, an East Rochester Police officer was almost struck by an angry recipient of a parking ticket. Upon being pulled back over, she was issued other traffic tickets for Unregistered and Uninspected motor vehicle.
- 12/24 A domestic dispute resulted in an ex boyfriend punching out the rear window of the victims vehicle and smashing it. The victim refused prosecution.
- 12/24 A Garfield Avenue resident reported having several Christmas presents stolen from the back seat of his unlocked vehicle. No witnesses.
- 12/25 A domestic dispute turned into an assault, when the victim was punched in the face and her nose was broken. The victim signed the paperwork for an arrest for Assault 3rd. The suspect was taken to jail with 2000.00 dollars bail.
- 12/25 A West Chestnut Street resident was sent to the hospital when her family discovered her with a black eye and possible facial injuries at her home on Christmas morning. Charges are pending against an ex boyfriend.
- 12/26 A routine traffic stop resulted in an arrest for Unlawful Possession of Marijuana. In addition, He was issued several traffic tickets and had an outstanding warrant from Rochester Police Dept. He was turned over to RPD on the warrant.

- 12/28 Unknown suspects damaged the outside accent lights on the Technoplex Mall at 300 Main Street.
- 12/28 A routine traffic stop for Failure to come to a stop at a stop sign yielded multiple drug charges for a Macedon resident. The vehicles had a Suspended Registration, and subsequent to being searched, the officer found large quantities of Heroin, needles, pills, and drug paraphernalia. The suspect had a large amount of cash on his person. He was charged with Unlawful Possession of Marijuana, Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance 3rd, Criminally Using Drug Paraphernalia 2nd. He was taken to the Monroe County jail on 10,000.00 cash bail.
- 12/29 Child Protective Services is investigation a mother on west Filbert Street told her teenage daughter, and other children she was going to Walmart. She didn't return until later the next day. The teen called her father in the morning, and he came in to report the incident
- 12/30 East Rochester Police responded to a fight call in front of a Main Street Bar. Upon arrival the victim was found walking up the road with blood all over his face. The victim returned and identified both of his attackers. One attacker was charged with Assault 3rd, and the second was charged with Harassment 2nd. A Fairport teen was charged with Unlawful Possession of Alcohol Under 21 With Intent to Consume. He was stopped while walking down the street with an open bottle of Smirnoff Vodka. His parents were called and took custody of him after the arrest.
- 12/31 An illegal party at a warehouse on Despatch drive was shut down after police discovered numerous people standing outside of the building. The owner of the building was identified and shut down the party.
- 12/31 The owner of a Main Street Bar reported that his coat was stolen sometime during the evening, by one of the patrons. It had been left on a nearby bar stool.

The East Rochester Police Department responded to 1,027 calls in the month of December. We responded to and took reports for 27 motor vehicle accidents. Three of these were personal injury accidents. We assisted with 21 fire calls and 30 ambulance calls. 8 residences were checked daily, because they have a special check on file at the police department, due to their owners being out of town. There were 24 arrests and 3 drug arrests.

With the Holidays over, and our heavy winter weather approaching, The Chief of Police would like to remind our residents that the DPW will be plowing and salting overnight, and we will be towing cars to keep the roads clear for the plows.

I am proud to report busy and successful year for the East Rochester Fire Department.

- We responded to **351** calls for service in 2010 which is a 7% decrease in calls from 2009.
- **17** or 5% of the calls were for fires of various types such as structures fires, cooking fires vehicle fires, and trash fires.
- **48** or 14% of the calls were for Rescue or Emergency medical service, such as motor vehicle accidents, and assisting with ambulance calls.
- **122** or 35% of the calls were for dangerous conditions in the district ranging from power lines down to fuel leaks.
- **80** or 23% of the calls were for service calls such as water problems, lock outs and assisting the police.
- **27** or 8% of the calls were for good intent calls that were generated by the concerned citizens of East Rochester that luckily did not warrant any action by the Fire Department upon arrival.
- **57** or 16% of the calls were false alarms or false calls such as automatic alarms, CO detectors, or system malfunctions.
- We answered **100%** of our calls in 2010 for the 112th year in a row.
- We provided equipment and manpower to several of our neighboring departments 32 times in 2010. They included Brighton, Fairport, Egypt, Bushnell's Basin, Pittsford, Webster, Morton, Henrietta, and Spencerport.
- We conducted 17 training events in 2010 for our members which included mandatory OSHA drills, structural firefighting, vehicle extrication, FAST and Mayday training.
- Our annual Fireman's Field Days was a huge success enjoyed by thousands of residents and neighbors.
- We are looking forward to a safe 2011.

It is truly my pleasure to serve as Chief of such a fine group of volunteers.

Our 59 members stand ready to serve the village when called upon.

- we took 12 calls out of district for our neighbors.
- we currently have 36 members on our roster. We have 24 members who are cleared to medic a call, 22 who are cleared to drive a call, of those numbers 17 are able to do both positions. We have 3 members in training. We have 4 members who are non running and help where needed.
