DECEMBER 2009 MONTHLY REPORT

- 12/01 A bicycle was reported stolen from the Morgan School on East Avenue. A witness gave a description of the suspect, and the direction of travel. Five minutes later An ER officer spotted the suspect on the bike several blocks away. He was taken into custody and charged with Criminal Possession of Stolen Property 5th.
- 12/02 A homeless man was arrested for trespass as he was found sleeping in the bathroom at the Eyer Park. He had been told many times not to stay there. He was taken to the Monroe County Jail.
- 12/05 A Pittsford Woman was issued an appearance ticket for allowing her Rotweiller to run loose, after it was struck on W. Commercial Street while chasing a jogger.
- 12/05 A Macedon man was charged with DWI after his vehicle crossed the double solid line in front of a Police Officer vehicle. He was issued several other traffic tickets. His vehicle was towed away.
- 12/06 During a routine traffic stop, the officer spotted a license plate looked suspicious. The vehicle contained two occupants that stated they had altered the plate to avoid detection that it had expired. They were both charged with Forgery 2nd. The driver was also charged with Criminal Possession of a Forged Instrument, Unregistered Motor vehicle, and Altered Display of Plates. The Female had several out of state warrants. Both suspects were taken to the Monroe County Jail.
- 12/08 A fight broke out between two 14 year olds on the way home from school, when a racial slur was uttered. One of the victims was treated and released from the hospital. The Investigation will continue due to conflicting stories.
- 12/10 A State trooper pulled over a Canandaigua man for speeding and discovered he had an arrest warrant out of East Rochester for the same traffic charges. He was turned over to East Rochester Police for arraignment.
- 12/12 East Rochester Police responded with the Fire Department to a working house fire on East Elm Street . The double house had a fire in the 1st floor bedroom. Everyone got safely out of the house. Fire investigators determined the cause as a faulty extension cord.
- 12/12 An East Rochester Police car sustained little damage, when it was rear ended while stopped at a red light. The striking vehicle had damage to its front bumper due to hitting the trailer hitch.
- 12/12 A vehicle that was pulled over for speeding yielded 3 teenagers admittedly smoked marijuana prior to being pulled over. They were all arrested for possession of marijuana as it was located in the vehicle. The driver was also issued a speeding ticket
- 12/15 An arrest warrant has been issued for a woman who issued a bad check to Bob Hastings Collision.
- 12/15 An arrest warrant has been issued for a Boces student who slapped another student while on the school bus in East Rochester.
- 12/15 A window on the upper window of a Woodneath Crescent residence was broken by a BB Pellet.

- 12/15 Two houses on W Filbert Street were also damage by the use of a bb gun. Damage was done to several windows and some siding was damaged.
- 12/18 The Chief of police was waived over by a citizen who observed a man drinking a beer in his car with a 5 year old in the back seat. The Chief executed a traffic stop, while he was asking for license and registration, the suspect attempted to drive away while the chiefs hand was still inside the car. After several attempts to stop him the passenger in the car put the car in park. The suspect was charged with, Reckless Endangerment, Endangering the Welfare of a Child, and Assault 2nd (injury to a police officer). Upon searching the vehicle subsequent to the arrest, several knives and hypodermic needles were found in the car. He was also charged with Criminal Possession of a Weapon 3rd. He is currently on Parole and his parole officer was notified of the arrest.
- 12/18 A home on West Spruce Street was burglarized and a laptop computer was taken.
- 12/20 An East Rochester youth was picked up for being out after curfew. He was issued an appearance ticket to East Rochester Court.
- 12/22 A home on W. Elm Street was burglarized and a GPS unit and a laptop computer were taken. The burglary appears to have occurred between 2:00 in the afternoon and 10:00 at night.
- 12/26 An East Rochester man was arrested for Trespass when he was walking on the rail road tracks. He was also in possession of drugs and was also charged with Criminal Possession of Controlled Substance 7th.
- 12/27 A West Filbert Street resident reported her vehicle stolen from the driveway. It was recovered three streets away several hours later with front end damage.
- 12/29 A North Lincoln Road resident reported her front picture window damaged by a bb, She didn't notice the hole until she took down her Xmas tree. Unknown when the incident actually happened.

The East Rochester Police Department responded to 1,075 calls in the Month of December. They assisted with 28 calls for the Ambulance Corps. They issued 112 traffic citations, and 72 Parking tickets. The Officers daily checked 14 homes while our residents are away in warmer climates. Chief Tando would like to remind all the residents that this is a service we provide for our village. If you are planning a vacation or long stay away, please call the police department and let them know, and we will add your residence to our house check list.

It is with great pleasure that I am presenting the East Rochester Fire Departments 2009 activity report.

- We answered **374** calls for service in 2009 which represents a 17% decrease in calls from 2008.
- Unfortunately this number includes three structure fires as well as three room and content fires in the fire protection district.
- We provided equipment and manpower to our neighboring departments 63 times in 2009.
- They included Fairport, Brighton, Penfield, Egypt, Mendon, Webster, Bushnell's Basin, Union Hill, and the City of Rochester.
- We answered 100% of our alarms in 2009 for the 111th year in a row.
- We conducted 26 training events in 2009 for our members which included mandatory OSHA drills, structural firefighting, vehicle extrication, fast, and rope rescue training.
- Our annual Firemen's Field Days was also a success enjoyed by the residents and neighbors of East Rochester.
- The Karknocker 5K race was also well attended and enjoyed by many.
- We are looking forward to a safe 2010.

Our 61 members stand ready to serve the village when called upon.

East Rochester Volunteer Ambulance Corps, Inc. monthly report for December 2009

1. The East Rochester Volunteer Ambulance Corps, Inc. answered 51 requests out of 65 received for the month of December for a call coverage percentage of 78%.
 - we covered 10 calls out of district for our neighbors, Perinton, Pittsford and Penfield
 - year to date for 2009, we have responded to **761** calls of **984** received with **25** members who are cleared to either drive, medic the call or both, with a year ending call coverage percentage of 77%.
 - we currently have 7 members in training.

2. We voted in one new member in December. We are currently processing applications for one potential new member.

3. With the winter weather upon us, the East Rochester Volunteer Ambulance Corps, Inc. is reminding everyone to be careful when out walking due to slippery conditions. Also, use care in shoveling driveways and sidewalks, make sure you are dressed properly for the weather and are not doing any heavy lifting.
