

Village Board Report February 2015

Village Board Members,

On January 10th the fire department responded to W. Hickory Street for a basement fire. First arriving units encountered heavy smoke conditions within the residence. The fire was partially extinguished by the homeowner, preventing the fire from spreading further. All occupants exited safely and without incident. Thankfully, several occupants were still awake at the time of the fire who were able to alert the rest of the family members that were asleep. **We continually remind everyone the importance of smoke and CO detectors. There were no working detectors at this residence.** Had this fire started while everyone was asleep the outcome could have been much worse.

Members of the FD have begun their annual mandated OSHA training in house. These indoor drills allow us to refresh our knowledge in the areas of Firefighter Safety, Blood Bourne Pathogens and Hazard Materials Awareness.

With the extreme winter weather conditions we have been experiencing this season we encourage our residents and business owners to adopt a fire hydrant in their neighborhoods. Keeping the fire hydrants clear of snow certainly saves time in the event that they are needed. The Fire Department does frequently conduct fire hydrant details to remove snow and ice. However, sometimes they can be missed or snow removal operations cause them to get buried again.

The ERFD responded to (41) incidents in the month of January (2) of which were to our neighboring departments.

Motion by Councilman Conners, seconded by Councilman Alfieri and carried unanimously to approve the Town Board Meeting minutes from January 15, 2015.


Motion by Councilman Alfieri, seconded by Councilwoman Monachino and carried unanimously to approve the Town Clerk monthly report for January 2015.
