East Rochester Fire Department Monthly Village Board Report February 2012

Village Board Members,

I am pleased to report the following activity for the East Rochester Fire Department during the month of January;

- We answered 34 alarms for the month of January.
- We provided equipment and manpower for (3) mutual aid calls to our neighboring departments in Pittsford, Fairport and Penfield.
- On January 17, the Rochester area experienced a high wind storm. The ERFD responded to (5) jobs all within an hour of the onset of the wind storm in which wires and/or trees were down at various locations throughout the village and fire protection district. We were able to safely mitigate the hazards found and we ensured that the village residents remained safe during the storm.
- We conducted (2) drills including our mandatory OSHA Firefighter Safety refresher.
- I would like to remind the village residents as winter nears the end, to continue to keep the fire hydrants on their street clear of snow in the event of a storm. This helps us not only to locate the hydrants more easily but it also helps us to be able to connect to a water supply quicker in the event of a fire.

The 53 volunteer members of the East Rochester Fire Department continue to serve the Village of East Rochester with pride and professionalism whenever called upon, 100% of the time.

JANUARY 2012

01/01 A Bluff Drive business reported that some of his inspection stickers are missing. The employees are being questioned as the investigation continues.

01/01 A Linden Avenue resident reports that her ex-husband's mother has been sending her threatening texts and phone messages. The paperwork has been signed for a warrant for Harassment.

01/03 A West Commercial Street resident had his ex-girlfriend arrested after she violated an Order of Protection by slamming his door causing it to shatter. She was charged with Criminal Contempt 2nd.

01/04 Police responded to a South Lincoln Road address for a domestic dispute in progress. The ex-boyfriend was arrested for Criminal Contempt 1st for violating an order of Protection, and Harassment. He was arraigned in front of a judge and sent to the Monroe County Jail on 2,500 bail.

01/04 Overnight someone drew graffiti all over the side of the Lobster trap on Fairport road.

01/05 Police responded to a motor vehicle accident at Fairport road and Marsh road. Upon arrival the officer observed two vehicles with their hazard lights on. The driver of the striking vehicle was on his cell phone and refused to get out of the car. Upon finally exiting the car, the driver could barely stand up, and had to brace himself against the car. The suspect continues to act in an aggressive manner to the officer. He was charged with Driving While Intoxicated, Aggravated Driving While Intoxicated, Felony Aggravated Unlicensed Operator, Following too Closely, and Resisting Arrest. A subsequent search of the vehicle yielded a knife and a 200ml of Southern Comfort. He was transported to the Monroe County Jail.

01/07 While on routine patrol, three males were observed in Edmund Lyon Park after hours. They were charged under the village ordinance, and issued appearance tickets. One of the suspects was also charged with Unlawful Possession of Marijuana.

01/08 An officer observed a vehicle driving down Fairport Road crossing the center line. Upon stopping the vehicle the officer observed a half full bottle of beer in the center console. He was charged With Driving While Intoxicated, Unsafe Lane Change, and Inadequate Muffler.

01/08 While executing an arrest warrant, the suspects girlfriend became irate and threw her shoes at the arresting officer striking him in his groin area. The warrant suspect was taken into custody without a problem, and the female was arrested for Harassment.

01/09 An East Rochester resident was arrested for open container as he walked down the street with an open bottle of Black Velvet in his hand.

01/10 An officer observed an adult male riding down West Commercial Street on a bicycle. It was 1:00 in the morning and he had no lights on his bike, and he was in the middle of an oncoming lane. The officer stopped the male. The suspect was intoxicated, and began to yell obscenities at the officer for stopping him. He was charged with Disorderly Conduct.

01/11 An argument between two East Rochester females erupted into one threatening to kill the other. She was charged with Aggravated Harassment and issued an appearance ticket for court.

01/12 Police responded to Wegmans for a shoplifter in custody. He was issued an appearance ticket for court, and banned from future admittance to the store.

01/13 Police and the fire department responded to a car fire on Mc Kinley Street. The vehicle had an electrical malfunction, and had to be towed away.

01/14 A domestic abuse resulted in the female being arrested for Harassment after she struck the male in the face. She was issued an appearance ticket for East Rochester court.

01/15 An officer noticed a vehicle speeding down Fairport Road in extremely icy conditions. Upon pulling the vehicle over it was determined that the driver was intoxicated. She was charged with DWI and speeding.

01/15 A Burger King Employee reported that a vehicle that had gone through the drive through had been smoking pot while placing his order. The vehicle was observed in the Country Club Parking lot and the driver was charged with Unlawful Possession of Marijuana 4th.

01/17 The Father of a 15 year old girl was reported to Child Protective Services after he struck her multiple times with his belt. The on Call ADA refused prosecution, and advised using Child Protective.

01/19 A female reported that her ex-boyfriend had threatened her with a knife, and fled her apartment. The male was located a block away, and upon being searched, he was found with a large folding knife in his pocket. He was charged with Menacing 2nd, and remanded to the Monroe County Jail.

01/21 A family trouble resulted in an arrest of a parent and a referral to Child Protective Services after a father and his 14 year old son got into a fist fight. The father was charged with Harassment 2nd.

01/23 A domestic dispute erupted into the female being punched in the face. The female pressed charges and the male was charged with Harassment 2nd, and issued an appearance ticket.

01/24 While responding to a domestic dispute the offending party got in her car to leave as the officers were arriving. They observed she was not wearing a seat belt, so they pulled the vehicle over. The driver had a suspended driver's license, no insurance, and the vehicle was unregistered. She was charged with Disorderly Conduct when she became verbally abusive to the officers.

01/26 A domestic dispute resulted in an arrest for the male after he violated a "No offensive contact" order of protection. He was arraigned in front of a judge and sent to the Monroe County Jail.

01/30 A West Filbert Street resident was arrested for a violation of the Noise Ordinance after he blasted his car stereo too loud, and disturbed the neighborhood. He was issued an appearance ticket.

01/30 A builder on Waterworks Drive reported missing tools, and metal from a house under construction.

01/31 A routine traffic stop resulted in the arrest of the driver after it was determined the license plates on his truck were reported stolen to Rochester Police Department. He was charged with Criminal Possession of Stolen Property 5th.

There were 1,012 calls in January from 911, as well as 587 self-initiated jobs taken by our East Rochester officers. There were a higher than normal number of self-initiated jobs due to so many village residents being out of town to go to warmer climates. Their residences are checked on average once a day. There were five DWI's, five Village Ordinance arrests, and 12 arrests for Driving Without a License. We assisted the Ambulance Corps on 32 calls, and the Fire Department on 17 calls. There were a total of 50 arrests in the month of January, the most for any January yet! Although this has been a mild winter there 134 parking tickets issued, mostly for parking between 3-6 am.
