1. Motion carried to appoint Mark McDermott, 124 E. Ivy St., to the East Rochester Housing Authority.
2. Motion carried to allow The Legend Group to offer additional investment options to Village of East Rochester Employees through our 457 Plan, (at no cost to village or employees) & authorize Clerk Treasurer to write letter requesting that additional investment options be included in our plan document.
3. Motion carried to modify General Fund Budget in the amount of \$11,272 for purchase of vehicle for Bldg. Dept; cost offset by insurance recovery.
4. Motion carried to acknowledge East Rochester Firefighter Marcus Holmes' change in residency to Penfield.
5. Trustee Florack thanked all involved with helping during the recent fire at 953 W. Linden Ave. Thanks to the ERFD, ERPD, ERVAC with a special thanks to the Verni family and the Northside Inn, whose workers made sure the victim was out safely.
6. Motion carried to increase IRS Standard Mileage Reimbursement Rate for the use of a personal vehicle for business purposes to \$.51 per mile, effective 1/1/2011, up from \$.50 per mile in 2010.
7. Motion carried to schedule Public Informational Meeting regarding the reconstruction and resurfacing of the Park Drive/East Ave. area on March 10, 2011, to begin after the Public Forum.

East Rochester Volunteer Ambulance Corps, Inc. monthly report for January 2011

- The East Rochester Volunteer Ambulance Corps, Inc. received 106 requests for service in the month of January and answered 55 of them for a 52% call coverage. Of the calls responded to 7 were by first responders, 21 were cancelled
 - ERVAC took 9 calls out of district for our neighbors.
 - ERVAC currently has 32 members on our roster. We have 22 members who are cleared to medic a call, 19 who are cleared to drive a call, of those numbers 17 are able to do both positions. We have 3 members in training. We have 4 members who are non running and help where needed.

JANUARY 2011

- 01/01/11 Routine traffic stops resulted in two separate drivers being charged with Aggravated Unlicensed Operator and Uninspected motor vehicles.
- 01/01/11 An 18 year old East Rochester Female returned home highly intoxicated after being at a party on Despatch Drive. The victim had to be transported to the hospital. The investigation will continue.
- 01/02 A North Lincoln Road resident was arrested after he stopped his girlfriend while driving away in her car and threatened to beat her, and destroy her vehicle. He was charged with Harassment and an Order of Protection was issued.
- 01/03 While running routine radar on West Commercial Street an East Rochester officer observed a vehicle go by at a high rate of speed. The vehicle was stopped, and the driver was found to have a suspended driver license. The driver was charged with Speeding Aggravated Unlicensed Operation, and no valid drivers license. The passenger was found to have an active arrest warrant out of Irondequoit. Upon searching the passenger, a gravity knife and a stun gun was found on his person. A subsequent search of the vehicle before towing revealed hypodermic needles and other drug paraphernalia. The passenger was charged with 2 counts of Criminal Possession of a weapon 3rd, and two counts of Criminal Possession of a Weapon 4th. The passenger was turned over to Irondequoit on their warrant.
- 01/05 A W. Commercial Street female called 911 when her ex-boyfriend tried to kick in her front door. He then went around to the back of the apartment and threw a 2"X4" board through her kitchen window and fled the scene. He was picked up on foot several streets over and charged with Criminal Mischief 4th, and Criminal Contempt 1st. He had violated an Order of Protection she had against him. He was taken to the county jail.
- 01/07 A home in the 200 block West Hickory Street was burglarized. The home owners discovered the back door to the house open, several flat screen televisions, video games, and jewelry were taken. The burglary happened in the late morning hours. The investigation will continue.
- 01/07 A resident in the 500 block of West Hickory reported that the rear window pane on the back door of his home was broken, police suspect an attempt break in. The suspect did not gain entry.

EAST ROCHESTER, NEW YORK . . . "the greatest little town in the world"

- 01/07 An Apple Street resident reported that the side window of his house had been smashed out by unknown suspects. He reported that his yard is used as a cut through for youths to get to other streets, and feels one of them did the damage.
- 01/07 The Pastor of the First Baptist Church reported that the church had been burglarized overnight. The exterior door, and interior doors had been pried open, and the office desk had been damaged. There was some petty cash taken, and a laptop computer. A technician responded and evidence was gathered. The investigation is continuing.
- 01/09 A Despatch Drive business reported that someone had raided their dumpster overnight taking metal drums. A canvas of local scrap metal dealers revealed that someone had dropped off the drums, however the dealer had no further information on the suspects.
- 01/10 A fight erupted between two brothers on South Lincoln Road. When police arrived both parties wanted the other arrested, and one brother had an order of protection against the other. One brother was arrested for Harassment, and issued an appearance ticket. The other brother was arrested for harassment, Criminal Contempt 2nd for violating the Order of Protection, and sent to the Monroe County Jail.
- 01/13 An East Irondequoit school bus driver had to call 911 after a fight broke out on his school bus in East Rochester. The Police responded and an ambulance was called for the victim of the Harassment. The school district is following up due to the age of the respondents'.
- 01/14 A routine traffic stop for an expired registration yielded an Aggravated Unlicensed Driver traffic ticket.
- 01/18 During routine patrol, an officer observed a vehicle in the curb lane of Fairport Road stopped with its hazard lights going. Upon checking the officer observed the driver to be passed out. The officer attempted to awake the driver at which time she opened her eyes and said "What the F@#\$ do you want?"
The officer had the driver exit the vehicle and she had trouble standing up. The breathalyzer test was done and the results were .28. She was charged with Aggravated DWI, Driving with a Blood Alcohol Content of over .08%, and Driving While Intoxicated. The vehicle was towed away, and a friend responded to pick her up.
- 01/19 A female left work at the Technoplex mall and discovered a picture of her taped to her car window. The picture was from an ex-husband that she has an Order of Protection against. Paperwork has been signed to have a warrant issued for his arrest.
- 01/19 A routine traffic stop yielded a driver who was very unresponsive, and seemed drunk. A breathalyzer test revealed no presence of alcohol, but the driver had trouble walking and standing. The driver stated he had a brain injury and problems with his legs. A driver's review form was sent to the DMV. He was issued several traffic tickets.
- 01/19 The mother of a couple who were arguing, became involved in the argument and was pushed down the stairs by the female combatant. She signed the paperwork for a harassment charge.

- 1/20 An East Rochester resident was at a friend's house in another town when the friend asked if he could use his vehicle while he went to work. The friend took the male to work in Fairport but never returned to pick him up at the end of his shift. When the male returned home, he found his back door kicked in, the house ransacked and cooking oil was smeared over the first floor. A cabinet that had been locked was found on its side with the door removed and all the valuable contents as well as a flat screen TV were missing from the residence. A neighborhood canvass produced negative results. The vehicle was located in Rochester and a lengthy investigation continued.
- 01/20 A Female reported receiving voice mails from her x boyfriend. She has an Order of Protection in place from a previous assault. It was a no Contact Order. He was arrested for Criminal Contempt 2nd , in addition to his current Assault 3rd charge.
- 01/21 An East Rochester female reported that her video game console and external hard drive from her computer had been stolen. She had allowed a man who was homeless to live with her for several months. He is missing too.
- 01/24 Three People were arrested for Petit Larceny after they went into Wegmans on Fairport Road and began to eat and drink things from off the shelves. They were stopped by security and charged with Petit Larceny. All were issued appearance tickets.
- 01/25 A Magnolia Avenue couple were arguing over who was going to make the baby a bottle at 3:00am. The female began to shake the husband to wake him up and he punched her in the face, breaking her nose. He was charged with Assault 3rd .
- 01/26 A worker at the Technoplex Mall reported having her prescription drugs stolen from her desk drawer. There were no witnesses.
- 01/28 An East Rochester resident was arrested for Trespass when he was observed going around parked cars in a private lot and looking in the windows at 2:45 in the morning. The no trespassing signs were clearly marked and the owner signed the paperwork for prosecution.
- 01/28 Police responded to an odor of gas call with the East Rochester Fire Department.. They observed that someone had poured a can of gasoline down the basement drain pipe. A suspect was being questioned regarding this, and while in his apartment the officer observed multiple weapons around the apartment. The suspect was known to have a previous felony conviction. The suspect was charged with Criminal Possession of a Weapon 4th (two counts). A shotgun, a rifle with a scope, a Billy club, and a cross bow were all removed from the residence for safekeeping at the police department
- 01/30 A domestic dispute resulted in the female party being arrested for Harassment when she slapped her boyfriend. She was issued an appearance ticket.
- 01/31 A home health care worker was arrested for Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance 7th after she admitted to stealing her patients' Vicoden .

The Police Department responded to 1,150 calls in the Month of January. There were 29 arrests, and 2 DWI arrests. There were 8 arrests for Aggravated Unlicensed Operator, and two Drug arrests. The police department checked 12-15 vacant residences daily for our residents who are out of town. We issued 189 Traffic tickets, and 57 parking tickets.

The Police Department sponsored a Child Safety Seat Workshop in conjunction with Fairport Police Department and the Monroe County Office of Traffic Safety. East Rochester received a grant to have this Workshop to purchase new car seats, and booster seats for various sized children. The East Rochester Schools donated the use of their barn so it could be done out of the elements.

Several new car seats and booster seats were given out to residents who had defective or outdated ones. At the workshop; parents are instructed how the seat should be properly installed, so if they need to move it to another vehicle, they will know how. There are also additional car seats left at the Police Department in case future residents may need them, and two additional inspections have been done since the Workshop.
