FEBRUARY MONTHLY REPORT

- 02/01 An East Filbert Street resident reports mail missing from her mailbox.
- 02/01 A resident on Dellwood Drive reported that his car had been entered in his driveway, and an I-pod and a gps unit had been taken during the night.
- 02/03 A resident of E. Rochester was issued several traffic tickets including Aggravated (AUO) Unlicensed Operation of a Motor Vehicle. 5 days later, the same Officer pulled this resident over again issuing another AUO. During this traffic stop, however, the suspect used his cell phone to call emergency dispatch to report a "FIGHT" at another village address to divert the Officer away. Subsequently, the investigation proved that he had made the unfounded report, so he was also arrested for Falsely Reporting an Incident.
- 02/04 A resident of Pine Street reported that his light bar had been removed from the roof of his truck. There were no witnesses.
- 02/05 A woman parked at the Piano Works Mall on West Commercial Street observed a male expose himself to her in the parking lot. A description of the vehicle he was driving was given to police. The investigation will continue.
- 02/06 An East Avenue resident called to complain about a large party at a house with numerous people outside, and a man urinating on the front of the house. The resident also complained about people banging on the outside of the house. Follow up to continue with the Building Inspector due to various code violations.
- 02/07 A South Lincoln Road resident reported her I-pod missing after she had a party at her house on Saturday night.
- 02/10 A McKinley Street resident reports that someone attempted to steal his truck that was parked in his driveway running. The footprints in the snow led from his back yard to his truck door and down his driveway. The vehicle was locked, entry was not gained.
- 02/11 An 18 wheeler parked on Linden Avenue was broken into and the contents were removed. Most of the contents were steel scraps. A technician was called to the scene, and the investigation is continuing.
- 02/12 A fight erupted between two women at a Main Street bar. The victim sustained facial cuts and bruises and has signed paperwork for a warrant to be issued. The suspect turned herself in and filed harassment charges against the victim on the same incident. Both were issued appearance tickets to court.

- 02/19 While on routine patrol on Fairport Road, a vehicle, operating in the right lane passed the Officer. She then pulled into his lane and as he followed her, he could detect she was speeding. He pulled her over without incident but could smell an odor of alcohol emitting from her breath. She was unable to do the field sobriety tests due to her apparent condition. A breath sample at the PD proved she was intoxicated. She was charged with Driving While Intoxicated.
- 2/24 A suspect entered a West Commercial Street business and started yelling vulgarities at the female owner. He threatened to hurt her and then her husband. These threats were over heard by a customer. The owners use to rent a room to the suspect but recently had him evicted for non payment. Police issued a warrant for his arrest, and expedited an order of protection.
- 2/25 An East Rochester man was arrested for trespass after he was observed walking along the rail road tracks. He was issued an appearance ticket for court.
- 2/27 An East Rochester male and female were arrested for Public Intoxication when they were picked up by police for running down the middle of Fairport Road screaming at each other. They had left their car sitting in the road. They were both agitated and intoxicated. They were issued appearance tickets and the vehicle was towed.

The East Rochester Police Department responded to 1,221 calls in February. They assisted on 38 Ambulance calls and 13 fire calls. 209 Traffic tickets were issued, this is the largest amount ever for the month of February. 10 vehicles were towed due to being parked over night on the street in violation of the snow parking regulations. Chief Tando would like to remind our residents to never leave their unlocked vehicle running in the driveway or the road. Several unsuccessful attempts have been made this month.

East Rochester Public Library Director's Report February, 2010

Regular and Special Programming:

Children's – Babies' Fun Time meet three times, with 41 participants. Six Outreach Story Times, which were conducted at two local Day Care Centers, had 61 children in attendance. Four Drop-In Story Times for ages 2-4 included 63 participants, and three Drop-In Story Times for ages 5-7 included 21 participants. Special programming included Drawing Dragons with Chris Pallace for ages 7-12, and had 13 children in attendance.

Adult's –The adult's Reading Discussion Group met on February 18th, and discussed Bel Canto by Ann Patchett, which was the annual selection for Writer's and Books: If All of Rochester Reads the Same Book. Thirteen people attended an energetic discussion of the book. The next meeting is at seven p.m. March 18th. All are welcome to attend this vibrant and fun group.
