Regular and Special Programming:

Children's – Babies' Story Time met 4 times with 65 in attendance. Pre-K Story Time met 2 times with 37 in attendance, and Crafty Kids Story Time met 3 times with 59 in attendance.

Young Adult- A Metal Valentines project had 11 in attendance. Three teen volunteers worked 22.75 hours.


