I am pleased to report the following activity for the East Rochester Fire Department during the month of February;

- We answered 23 alarms for the month of February. Our year to date alarm total is 57.
- We provided equipment and manpower for (2) mutual aid calls to our neighboring fire departments in Fairport and Brighton.
- We conducted our mandatory OSHA Hazardous Materials Safety refresher drill.
- The East Rochester Fire Department will be opening our doors to village residents on Sunday April 22, 2012 for a recruitment-based open house. The open house is taking place during National Volunteer Week and is part of the Recruit NY initiative encouraged by the Firemen's Association of the State of New York. We encourage anyone who is interested in becoming a volunteer firefighter or anyone who would like to learn what it takes to be a volunteer firefighter to stop by. The people will be able to meet our team of volunteers and have a chance to learn about our duties and equipment we commonly use. # East Rochester Police Department

## February 2012

02/01 An East Rochester resident reported that his ex-girlfriend who live out of state has been sending threatening text to himself and several of his friends. He signed the paperwork to have her arrested.

02/02 An East Rochester resident reported that while she was on the thruway a man in a red jeep appeared to be following her. The vehicle exited with her off the thruway and exited again at East Rochester. She made some swift turns and lost the jeep, but later observed it slow down and drives past her house in ER. She got three of the license plate numbers, and our officer is attempting a group DMV search to find the owners name. The case is still under investigation.

02/03 Security at the Technoplex Mall reported an open door late at night. Upon searching the building nothing appeared to be disturbed, but a window had been kicked in on the south side.

02/06 An elderly resident returned to her house after having surgery to discover that several items and some cash were missing from her home. No suspects or witnesses.

02/06 A West Commercial Street business reported that two teens who were fighting with each other fell against the building-breaking the plate glass window the in process. Both teens fled the scene with no apparent injuries.

02/06 Police responded to a Main Street address for report of a man with a knife beating a female, and threatening other residents trying to intervene. Upon arrival the man had been subdued by the other residents and there was blood all over the apartment. A female was lying on the floor and stated she had been stabbed with the knife. The ambulance took her to the hospital and he was taken into custody. Due to the severity of the wounds, he was charged with Assault 1<sup>st</sup> (felony), and Menacing 2<sup>nd</sup>. He was transported to the Monroe County Jail on \$5,000. Bail -\$10,000 bond.

02/07 Our police officer stopped a man walking into town because he knew he had an arrest warrant with East Rochester. He was carrying a backpack that contained only a long rope. As the officer knew he had attempted to hang himself before, and was not making any sense, he was taken into custody under the arrest warrant and sent to the hospital under the Mental Hygiene Law. He was issued an Appearance ticket for East Rochester Court.

02/10 While running radar on Fairport Road, an officer observed a vehicle speed past at 54 MPH in a 40 zone. Upon pulling the vehicle over, the officer observed the driver to be intoxicated. He was charged with Driving While intoxicated and felony Aggravated Unlicensed Operator.

02/13 A Garfield Avenue resident returned home to his apartment to find the door jimmied. Although he observed some objects to be moved, He reported that nothing appeared to be missing.

02/17 An East Elm Street resident reported that two males were going door to door asking to see their RG&E bills. They were stopped by police a few doors down, and stated they were canvassing the neighborhood for Just Energy. They were advised they needed a permit to do this and were escorted out of town.

02/18 A female shoplifter was arrested for taking over \$160.00 in items from the Rite Aid on West Commercial Street. She was charged with Petit Larceny.

02/19 Animal Control and the Police responded to a West Avenue residence for a complaint of barking dogs. The officer observed three dogs in the back yard who were continually barking. They were not able to contact the owner, and no food or shelter was being provided for the animals. The officer checked on the dogs several times during the day, and called Animal Control later in the day. Animal Control decided to remove the dogs to a shelter.

02/21 Officers responded to a domestic dispute on West Avenue. Upon arrival to the apartment, They observed a man leaning over the sink bleeding profusely from his head. The female also was bleeding from a laceration on her cheek. They had been fighting each other with a large kitchen knife. The male was transported to the Hospital for stitches, and the female was treated by the ambulance crew and released. Both parties were arrested. The female was charged with Assault 2<sup>nd</sup>, and the Male was charged with Assault 3<sup>rd</sup>.

02/24 A female resident was observed staggering across Main Street with a contusion on her head. She was stopped by an officer and was observed to be highly intoxicated. She was charged with public Intoxicatio0n under the Village Ordinance.

02/25 A customer at Hoselton Chevrolets parts department attempted to grab a part off the counter and ran with it. The manager got a license plate number and the vehicle was stopped in East Rochester. The suspect was arrested for Petit Larceny, and issued An appearance ticket. The part was held for evidence.

02/25 While stopped behind a vehicle at a red light. The vehicle did not go when the light turned green, and then proceeded to turn left on a red light. The vehicle was pulled over and the driver was intoxicated. He was charged with Driving while intoxicated, Moving from Lane Unsafely, Impeding an Intersection, and Open Container in a Vehicle.

02/27 A report of a suspicious vehicle at the A-plus yielded a man sleeping in his car, which was running in the parking lot. Video footage revealed that the driver pulled in, and never left the vehicle. The driver was charged with Driving While Intoxicated, Aggravated Driving while intoxicated for being over .18.

02/28 A West Commercial Street grocery store reported that two suspects entered the store, and removed several items by placing them under their coats and walking out. When our officer reviewed the footage, he knew both of the perpetrators, and went to their house. They still had the items on the kitchen counter. Both suspects were charged with Petit Larceny, and issued an appearance ticket for East Rochester Court.

02/29 A Main Street resident reported that her two front tires were slashed in her driveway overnight. No suspects or witnesses.

There were 911 calls from 911 in February. There were 24 arrests. The police also took 544 self-initiated calls. They responded with the Fire Department on 13 calls and the Ambulance Corps on 44 calls. There were 127 traffic tickets issued, and 3 DWI's.
