- We answered 39 alarms for the month of March.
- We provided equipment and manpower for 4 mutual aid requests to our neighbors in Fairport and Egypt, as well as responded with the Third Battalion Rope Rescue Team to assist with a person trapped in the water on Lake Ontario.
- One call of significance; on March 16th we responded for the odor of natural gas in the 200 block of East Commercial street and found that gasoline had leaked into the sanitary sewer system. The odor then migrated through the sewer system leading to numerous calls in a five block area. This caused our men and equipment to be tied up for several hours.
- We held our third OSHA mandatory drill; Firefighter Safety. Included in this drill was a presentation by CSX Railroad regarding Rail Safety for Emergency Responders.
- We held our Annual Inspection Dinner on March 19th.

It is truly my pleasure to serve as Chief of such a fine group of volunteers.

Our 58 members stand ready to serve the village when called upon.
