MARCH MONTHLY REPORT

- 3/03 Police responded to a 911 call for a motor vehicle accident at Hoselton's on Fairport Road. The officer did smell alcohol from the driver's breath. While writing the accident report, the intoxicated driver, pulled a cigarette from his pajama pants, and with it, a small green bag of pills fell to the ground. The officer secured the bag and the subsequent search revealed 3 more pills. The officer requested the apparent intoxicated driver to submit to field sobriety tests but he refused. He was transported to the PD where he vacillated on taking the breath test. He agreed but when the tech. came from Fairport to submit the test, he refused. The officer felt a blood sample should be obtained for the suspicion of being under the influence of a narcotic as well as alcohol. He was taken to RGH where a blood sample was drawn. He was returned to the PD to finish processing. The man has a previous conviction of DWI in 2002. He was arraigned in E. Rochester Court and remanded to MCJ \$2500 cash/bond. Further charges are pending on the toxicology results.
- 03/04 A juvenile was observed by a citizen at the Piano Works Mall going through cars in the rear parking lot. The juvenile was confronted by the owner of the car, an altercation began as the owner struggled with the youth to get his backpack back. The property was returned and the owner did not wish prosecution.
- 03/06 An unidentified Man entered the Red Apple on Washington Street and ran out carrying a 12 pack of Budweiser beer. The male fled on foot, some items were found during the foot pursuit, but the suspect was captured.
- 03/06 An Officer on lunch break observed a small child walking alone down the sidewalk. The officer asked the child where she live and she didn't know. She indicated she was three years old. The officer was walking with the child, when a car pulled up looking for her. The father did not know she had left the house. He was charged with Endangering the Welfare of a Child, and issued an appearance ticket for court.
- 03/08 East Rochester Police, and the Monroe County Sheriffs responded to a burglary in progress call at the Roosevelt Road gas station. Three suspects were taken into custody. One of the suspects was in possession of a gun. Upon arresting them merchandise was found in their possession from two other businesses in East Rochester. A large amount of property was recovered. Two suspects were taken to the County Jail, the third suspect was a juvenile and was taken to a juvenile detention shelter. All were charged with Burglary 2nd, Criminal Mischief, and Larceny.
- 03/09 The juvenile from the above Burglary was found on the streets of East Rochester after curfew. He was returned to his guardian, who will have to appear in ER court.
- 03/09 An East Rochester man was arrested for Harassment during a neighbor trouble call. He was highly intoxicated and became abusive during the altercation. He was arraigned in front of a judge, and remanded to the county jail in lieu of \$500.00 bail.

- 03/09 An East Rochester teenager was pulled over for loud music emitting from his car. He was charge with a violation under Village Ordinance, and was issued an appearance ticket to court.
- 03/09 The Police Clerk assisted the Morrison County Sheriffs Department with identifying A dead body found along side a ditch in Kennebunk Port Maine. Her Identification showed her as a resident of East Filbert Street. We were able to assist them in finding her next of kin for a death notification. Foul play was not suspected.
- 03/10 East Rochester police responded to a 911 call for a man threatening suicide with a rifle. A perimeter was established and the suspect agreed to come out of the house voluntarily. He was taken by ambulance to the hospital. The guns were removed from the house.
- 03/11 Police responded to a report of a fight between neighbors on Oak Street. Police arrived on scene to find approximately 15 people on the street yelling at each other. The argument was between teenagers, and parents trying to break up a fight. No charges were filed.
- 03/12 A Fairport resident was pulled over after passing an East Rochester Police car and crossing the double solid line. The driver was charged with Driving While Intoxicated, and driving with a blood alcohol content over .18%.
- 03/13 An East Rochester woman's x boyfriend took her vehicle without permission and got into an accident in the city of Rochester. The boyfriend was injured in the accident, and upon being release from the hospital, he was charged with Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle. He was issued an appearance ticket for East Rochester Court.
- 03/16 A Fairport resident was pulled over for traveling 46mph in a 30 zone. The vehicle traveled over ½ a mile and finally stopped in front of a green light. The female driver was apparently intoxicated. She refused the breathalyzer, and was charged with DWI.
- 03/16 An East Rochester resident was assaulted by an unknown assailant with a baseball bat. The victim called the police after the assault occurred and was unable to identify his attacker. The investigation will continue.
- 03/16 R/O responded to a residence for a report of people fighting. While pulling in front of location, a female was shouting and pointing at a black vehicle going down the road .The officer pulled directly in front of the vehicle with his lights and sirens thus prohibiting any further movement. When he spoke to the male driver, it was apparent he intoxicated. After he failed the sobriety tests, he was taken to Fairport PD where a breathalyzer test showed a .18%. It was determined while processing that he also had a prior DWI in 2005 and a DWAI in 2007. This DWI became a felony charge, and he was arraigned in E.R. Court, and remanded to Monroe County Jail on \$2,500 cash/bond.
- 3/17 A business owner in E. Rochester came to the police department to report that he had several checks missing from various accounts. Upon speaking with his banks, it was determined that the checks had been cashed totaling \$2,829.00. The owner told the police that his son was the suspect. The officers went to the son's residence in Fairport where he admitted stealing and cashing the checks. The son was arrested and given an appearance ticket to East Rochester Court. Possible other charges could be added (Forgery/Grand Larceny) through the Monroe County Sheriffs investigation.
- 03/18 A Linden Avenue resident reported damage to his garage door, where someone had tried to force the door with a pry bar. No entry was gained.
- 03/18 A high school girl observed a man walking towards her on the sidewalk near West Hickory street, open his trench coat and expose himself. He had no pants on. The male left the scene in a small dark green 4 door sedan. He is described as a white male,

wearing a tan trench coat dark shoes, white socks, and a knitted cap. The female fled to a safe house, and reported the incident.

- 03/21 A male was observed on E Chestnut Street wearing gang colors and acting in a suspicious manner. He was stopped and identified; the officer observed several lumps in his clothing and found several cans of beer on his person. He was charged with Unlawful Possession of Alcohol by a minor. He was issued an appearance ticket for court.
- 03/21 Two Rochester residents were issued tickets for being in the park after hours.
- 03/22 The Techoplex Mall at 300 Main Street reported damage to its spot lights at ground level. skateboarders are suspected of doing the damage.
- 03/22 A North Lincoln Road resident reported his bicycle missing from his back yard.
- 03/23 East Rochester Police responded to a noise complaint to find a male who had a large quantity of Marijuana on him. He was charged with Criminal Possession of Marijuana 5th.
- 03/23 A domestic dispute between a male and female ended with the female being arrested for Assault 3rd after she kicked the male in the face. She was taken to the hospital after she expressed suicidal thoughts.
- 03/24 A routine traffic stop for a Stop Sign violation, resulted in an additional charge of Disorderly Conduct when the driver became began to use foul and abusive language at the police officer in a public place.
- 03/25 At the request of the Pennsylvania State Police, we executed a fugitive warrant to a man staying with relatives in East Rochester. He was arraigned in front of a judge and sent to the Monroe County jail to be extradited back to Pennsylvania.
- 03/29 An East Rochester resident was arrested for shoplifting from the Dollar General on West Commercial Street.
- 03/29 A vehicle containing four East Rochester youths was pulled over after leaving Eyer Park. The driver had marijuana on him and was arrested for Unlawful Possession of Marijuana.

The East Rochester Police Responded to 1,313 calls in March. They issued 185 Parking tickets, and 197 Traffic Citations. There were four DWI arrests, and 6 Village Ordinance arrests. We also assisted on 26 ambulance calls, and 12 fire calls.

Chief Tando would like to remind everyone that due to the recent nice weather, there has been a spike in thefts from cars. It is happening in the overnight hours. Several Gps units, credit cards, and valuables have been stolen. Please don't leave anything of value in plain view in your vehicle. If you must, put them where they can't be seen and lock your car.

East Rochester Public Library Director's Report March, 2010

Regular and Special Programming:

Children's – Babies' Fun Time meet five times, with 87 participants. Ten Outreach Story Times, which were conducted at two local Day Care Centers, had 96 people in attendance. Three Drop-In Story Times for ages 2-4 included 48 participants; and three Drop-In Story Times for ages 5-7 included 32 participants. Special programming included a book discussion of the series 39 Clues, which had 7 children in attendance, and the newly organized puppet club met twice, with 9 children in attendance.

Adult's –The adult's Reading Discussion Group met on March 18, and discussed People of the Book by Geraldine Brooks. Fourteen people attended this lively discussion. Ann Patchett, last month's author of Bel Canto, presented a lecture at the Penfield Library, which four people attended.

The next meeting is at seven p.m. April 15th. All are welcome to attend this vibrant and fun group.

East Rochester Volunteer Ambulance Corps, Inc. monthly report for March 2010

1. The East Rochester Volunteer Ambulance Corps, Inc. answered 64 requests out of 76 received for the month of March for an 84% call coverage.
 - we took 11 calls out of district for our neighbors.
 - we currently have 36 members on our roster, 27 of whom are cleared to either drive or medic a call. We have 6 members in training. We have 4 members who are non running and help where needed.
 - we are currently processing 1 application for a potential new member.
 - we are still in need of help on our days calls.

2. Our annual fund drive is now underway. Please support your 100% volunteer ambulance corps with your donation.

3. Remember that anytime you are injured or ill, it is an emergency for you. But sometimes minor injuries and illnesses take our ambulance out of service and we are unavailable for more serious medical problems. To know when to call for an ambulance please check the East Rochester Volunteer Ambulance website at www.erambulance.org or the Village of East Rochester website at www.eastrochester.org and read the article Urgent Care Center or Emergency Room. Our area has 3 urgent care centers, 1 in Penfield (Eastside Urgent Care), 1 in Pittsford (Excel Care) and 1 in Fairport (Immediate Care East).

4. With the spring weather upon us, please use care when cleaning up your yards and watch for children playing and riding bikes.
