Regular Board Meeting called to order by Mayor Fred Ricci at 7:10 PM.

Public Comment

Laura Sirianno, representing Village Fair, 119 W. Commercial St., asked the Board to consider installing short term parking signs in the area between Village Fair and Despatch Pizza Kitchen during the evening hours of 6-10 pm. Motion by Trustee Flanigan, seconded by Trustee Florack, and carried unanimously to install signs for a 90-day trial period.

Doug Romach, 209 Park Dr., asked the Board to change parking regulations for Park Drive to allow parking on the park side of the street instead of the house side, in order to improve visibility on the curve as well as improve visibility for residents backing out of their driveways. Motion by Trustee Conners, seconded by Trustee Alfieri, and carried unanimously to establish June 11 as the date for public hearing to change parking regulations on Park Drive.

Frank Brothers, 805 Garfield St., asked to Board to consider starting a community garden.

Rosalie Rosini, 210 Linden Ave., asked the Board to consider installing another light on the Linden Ave. lift station for security purposes. She was also informed that her sidewalk request made at a previous meeting is still under review by Parrone Engineering. She also requested that the bench be put back at Northside Park.

Joe Giambrone, new owner of 129 W. Commercial St., encouraged the Board to increase parking for businesses on Commercial St.

Sam Morabito, 30 Dellwood Dr., asked the Board if the Village would incur any cost for the Festa Italia, which is scheduled for June 8, 9, & 10 in Edmund Lyon Park. East Rochester Fire Department Monthly Village Board Report
May 2012

Village Board Members,

I am pleased to report the following activity for the East Rochester Fire Department during the month of April;

- We answered 27 alarms for the month of April. Our year to date alarm total is 133.
- We provided equipment and manpower for (6) mutual aid calls to the Fairport Fire Department and (1) mutual aid call to the Brighton Fire Department.
- In the early morning of April 2nd we were dispatched to 1387 Fairport Rd with the Fairport Fire Department for a report of a building fire. The involved structure was an office building which housed several businesses. The fire was so well involved before any fire apparatus or personnel arrived that it made the fire suppression efforts very difficult. We responded with our engine 324 and ladder 320 with full crews who spent several hours battling this large fire. Once again the ERFD did a great job supporting our neighboring fire department.
- We have begun our outdoor firematic drills for this year and look forward to a very productive training season.
- Our spring recruitment open house went very well and I would like to thank everyone who came down to either show their support or to find out more about becoming a volunteer firefighter. We are anticipating between four and five new applicants from this recruitment initiative. We are continuously recruiting new members and if anyone is interested in joining we encourage them to stop by the fire hall or visit our website at www.erfd.org
- We will be kicking off the 2012 parade season with the East Rochester Memorial Day parade on Saturday May 26th. We hope to see you all there!
- We would like to say thank you to everyone for your continued support!

APRIL 2012

04/01 While on routine patrol, an officer observed a vehicle in front of him swerve suddenly into the left hand lane and then back into the right hand lane nearly losing control of the vehicle. The car was pulled over and the driver was charged with DWI, Refusal to Take a Prescreen, Moving from Lane Unsafely, Unsafe Lane Change, and No Seat Belt.

04/01 Two St. John Fisher Students were charged with Speeding by East Rochester Officers. While speaking to the driver the officer observed several signs belonging to "Fairport Hots". Further inspection of the vehicle yielded several street signs and a "No Dumping" sign belonging to the Village of Victor. Fairport Hots refused prosecution, and officers are following up with the Village of Victor for filing further charges regarding their property. The village of Victor declined prosecution.

04/03 A domestic dispute resulted in the paperwork being signed and sent to court for a Harassment 2nd charge. The female had been slapped and knocked down.

04/05 A vehicle was stopped on Commercial St. for a village ordinance of loud music playing. The driver immediately identified himself and told the Officer that his license was revoked. He arrested the male and upon an inventory search of the vehicle, 4 Vicodin pills were located. The suspect was given appearance tickets for the Noise Violation, Criminal Possession of Controlled Substance, Aggravated Unlawful driving Without a License, and Operation of a Vehicle Without a Court Ordered Interlock System.

04/06 A Garfield Street resident reported that someone in front of his location was observed puncturing tires on a red SUV. He observed the suspect going inside a nearby address. Officers knocked on the door and questioned a male that had a large pocket knife in his front shirt pocket in plain view. Upon further questioning the male admitted to slashing 2 of the tires. He was transported to the PD and signed a voluntary statement admitting to the crime. He was charged with Criminal Mischief 4th, and Criminal Possession of a Weapon.

04/09 While on routine patrol, an officer observed a man sitting in a vehicle in a parking lot for several minutes. When the officer approached the vehicle he could smell a strong odor of marijuana. A pipe and the some marijuana were located. The male was arrested and charged with Unlawful Possession of Marijuana.

04/10 Officers responded to a report of a domestic dispute. The victim was bleeding from her hand and was very uncooperative about the incident. A witness advised the officer that a male and the victim had gotten into an argument. The male threatened to kill the female and had damaged a laptop and a television during the dispute. The witness also confirmed that the male had threatened the female with a knife waving it in front of her face. They also confirmed that the female had punched the television set and that is how she obtained the laceration to her hand. The male had left the scene upon police arrival. When the officer were transporting the children of the victim to a family member's house in East Rochester, the child told Officers that the male was hiding in that basement location. The male was apprehended, arrested and taken to jail.

04/10 An appearance ticket was issued to a female visitor from Honeoye Falls for Public Intoxication as she was observed urinating on private property.

04/11 An E. Rochester resident was arrested for Criminal Mischief 4th, after he went to another resident's house and started banging on the window. An argument ensued between the 2 males and the window was smashed out during the verbal altercation.

04/12 An E. Rochester resident was arrested during a domestic incident. An argument over a cell phone caused victim's hands to become cut and scratched during the struggle. The male suspect left the scene of the incident, while he was backing out of the driveway, the car door hit the head of their 3 year old son. The ambulance responded, to assess the child's injuries. The Male was later charged with Harassment 2nd.

04/12 A Madison Street resident reported that someone stole a tire out of the back of his pickup truck overnight.

04/14 A police officer observed a vehicle drive by with one head light out. Upon stopping the vehicle he observed the driver to be intoxicated. He was charged with Driving While Intoxicated, and Inadequate Lights.

04/15 Irondequoit Police requested assistance locating a vehicle that had been involved in a larceny in their jurisdiction. A partial plate had been obtained and the vehicle was located in East Rochester, and pulled over. The driver's license had been suspended six times. Upon searching the vehicle, several hypodermic needles, and a package of Heroin was also discovered. He was charged with Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance, Criminal Possession of a Hypodermic Instrument, and Aggravated Unlicensed Operator.

04/15 Several Burglaries were reported in the two hundred block of West Elm Street, several purses were removed from the premises. On Monday the 16th a resident reported finding several purses in the backyard of a home in the 300 block of West Elm. A crime scene technician responded and took photos and captured several fingerprints. The purses that were recovered were from the 200 block Burglaries. The investigation is continuing.

04/15 911 call from a citizen viewing an apparent hand to hand drug deal taking place on Main St., yielded 1 arrest for drugs, unlicensed operation and unlicensed operator. The caller was able to get a description and plate number of the vehicle involved, called 911 and ERPD was able to apprehend the suspect.

04/16 Police responded to a report of a hit and run on a vehicle on Pine Street. A witness got license plate # and the officer got ahold of the driver who stated she would be right back to the scene, because she wanted to bring her parents. The driver of the vehicle was 16 years old and appeared to be intoxicated. She was barely able to stand, and seemed to be having trouble staying awake. She was transported to the hospital, where she consented to a blood sample, and was charged with Driving While Intoxicated, Driving While Impaired by Drugs, and Leaving the Scene of an Accident. Further charges could be pending after the results of the blood test.

04/16 While investigating a motor vehicle accident, the officer observed marijuana, and a pipe in the passengers purse. She was charged with Unlawful Possession of Marijuana.

04/18 A shoplifter fled Wegmans on Fairport road with \$60.00 worth of merchandise. He was pursued by loss prevention and while running continued to drop items in the parking lot. All of the items were recovered, and a review of the tapes to determine the suspect is continuing.

04/18 A vehicle was pulled over on Magnolia Avenue for Excessive noise. The Driver was issued an appearance ticket.

04/21 A woman pulled her car over to the curb to visit with her parents. She left cash and a debit card on the front seat of her car. When she returned to the vehicle, both were reported missing.

04/24 A suspicious vehicle parked near Burger King was approached by an officer, and the occupants inside were observed inside the car, smoking Marijuana. Two of the passengers were charged with Unlawful Possession of Marijuana.

04/25 A resident reported that her iPod Touch was taken off the front seat of her vehicle while she was parked at the Piano Works Mall. Her car was not locked.

04/25 A routine traffic stop yielded an arrests for Possession of Marijuana. An appearance ticket was issued.

04/27 A 911 call for two men fighting with knives, yielded two arrests for Disorderly Conduct, No weapons were found on the combatants.

04/28 Police responded to a complaint of an underage drinking party in the one hundred block of West Elm St. Upon arrival several underage youths were observed with beer in their hands, and loud music blasting from the house. The two adults living at the address were charged with Unlawfully Dealing with a Child- 6 counts, and Endangering the Welfare of a Child- 2 counts. One 16 year old was also charged with Unlawful Consumption of Alcohol by a minor in a residence.

04/30 Police responded to a domestic dispute involving a mother vs. daughter. The daughter was out of control and throwing household items at her mother. The daughter was issued an appearance ticket for Harassment 2nd.

There were 963 calls issued from 911 center this month, and 653 self-initiated calls from the police officers. They assisted at 30 Ambulance calls, and 14 Fire calls. There were a total of 34 arrests for the month. 41% of these arrests were drug and alcohol related.
