Public Comment

Lisa Romach, 209 Park Dr., presented the East Rochester PTA Distinguished Service Award to Casey Filiaci for his many years of involvement as Music Director for East Rochester Sing Out.

Elaine Murabito, 325 E. Elm St., and Christine Prokop, 326 E. Elm St., expressed concerns over the rental property at 323 E. Elm St. Concerns include dog droppings, disturbances, garbage strewn on property, uncut lawn, and general lack of upkeep.

Administrator D'Ambrose to coordinate a meeting with neighbors of said property and Building Inspector to develop a strategy for addressing concerns.

Margot Gilhart, 220 Northwood Ave., stated that she was very pleased with the Festa Italia and hopes that it will be back next year. She also believes that the best placement for a stop sign on Main St. is at Ivy St.

Bob and Jan Case, 611 Main St., spoke against the stop sign on Main St. at Spruce St., stating that many vehicles are still "running" the sign. They suggested installing a "Speed Limit Strictly Enforced" sign in the area.

Sam Morabito, 30 Dellwood Dr., spoke on the following:

- Regarding refuse fees, he suggested that the fee schedule reflect incremental increases for 5-unit dwellings & up instead of lumping them into one price category.
- He encouraged the Village to enforce the removal of garage sale signs from poles in a timely manner.
- He expressed concern over how Eyer Building Project would be financed.

Gina Fioravanti-Louth, owner of rental property at 106 Oak St., expressed concern over the neighboring property with regard to:

- The 3-unit garage, which appears to have been rented out to various businesses.
- Employees from aforementioned businesses stealing water from her property, as well as urinating on her property.
- Excessive profanity

Mrs. Fioravanti-Louth expressed her frustration over the lack of progress made in the last year with regard to these concerns. Building Inspector Dave Smith stated that the case is currently in court & could not speak publicly about the matter.

East Rochester Fire Department Monthly Village Board Report June 2012

Village Board Members,

I am pleased to report the following activity for the East Rochester Fire Department during the month of May;

- We answered 38 alarms for the month of May. Our year to date alarm total is 165.
- We provided equipment and manpower for (4) mutual aid calls to the Fairport Fire Department.
- During the overnight hours on May 5th the ERFD was dispatched to the 300 block of E. Commercial St. for a burning odor outside. As a routine practice, the fire dispatcher updated the responding units of a current wind speed and direction. This information was a crucial part of this call as it led in the direction of Ontario St. While checking Ontario St, ERFD and ERPD units found smoke venting out of the large MIG warehouse building (100 Ontario St). Additional units from Fairport, Pittsford and Penfield were called into the scene due to the smoke condition found and the size of the building involved. What we encountered was a fire burning in an attached trash compactor dumpster on the east end of the building. The fire was quickly extinguished with no extension into the main building. This was a good example of how a seemingly routine smoke odor call resulted in the discovery of a fire at a nearby structure. The early detection and notification prevented this fire from becoming much worse. Great job by all!
- During the overnight hours on May 26th the ERFD was dispatched to the Parkside Manor Nursing Home at 420 Main Street for a report of a fire on the second floor. Arriving units did encounter a smoke condition on the second floor which appeared to be coming from a laundry room. Due to the smoke condition found, the size of the building and the occupancy involved, additional units from Fairport and Penfield were called into the scene to assist. Investigation revealed that a motor in a washing machine in the second floor laundry room overheated which caused the smoke condition. The incident was mitigated quickly and the residents and staff were able to return into the building with little inconvenience. Another job well done!!
- We encourage all residents to come out and support the ERFD during the 2012 parade season. The parade schedule will be posted on our website (www.erfd.org)
- We would like to remind everyone that our Fireman's Field Days will be held this year beginning July 25th and running through July 28th. Pre-sale ride tickets will be available at the village office. The Chicken BBQ will be at the Fire Hall on Thursday July 26th
- We thank you for your continued support!

May 2012

05/01 A domestic dispute between a brother and sister became physical. The brother was arrested for Harassment. He was issued an appearance ticket to court.

05/01 Police responded to Strong Memorial Hospital for a report of a stabbing that had occurred in East Rochester. Upon interviewing the victim, the place of the event would have been in plain sight of many establishments at a busy time of day. The victim did suffer from a stab wound to the abdomen; however a search of the crime scene, and interviewing several people who were present at the alleged time yielded no results or evidence. The victim has a history of Mental Health arrests. Case closed pending corroborating evidence.

05/03 A resident of East Elm Street was issued an appearance ticket for a loud car stereo, under the Village Ordinance.

05/04 A Linden Avenue business reported a Welder, generator, and many air tools being stolen from a work truck overnight.

05/05 Police responded to the Burger King on Fairport Road for a customer who wanted the employees arrested because they did not serve her burger the way she wanted it. She had purchased the burger at the Penfield Burger King and was attempting to return it to the East Rochester Burger King. The victim felt that because she was having hunger pains, she had the justification for an arrest. No charges were filed and she went away hungry. She was not happy.

05/06 An officer witnessed a vehicle cross the double solid line on Washington Street several times. Upon pulling the vehicle over the driver was found to be intoxicated. He was charged with Moving from Lane Unsafely, Failure to keep Right, DWI, Aggravated DWI and Failure to take a Prescreen.

05/06 A Bluff Drive Business owner reported a small flatbed trailer being stolen from his parking lot. The business owner actually spotted his trailer on the back of another pickup truck later that day. He attempted to get a license plate, but the driver sped away.

05/07 The owner of a business on West Commercial Street reported that they had purchased from a customer 22 silver coins. They customer showed the owner two coins, and said he had twenty more. He was then paid for all the coins, and left. After he left they discovered that the other twenty coins were actually counterfeit. The United state Secret Service is following up on this case.

05/07 An East Rochester resident won a jackpot at the Bingo Palace in Irondequoit. After collecting her winnings, she returned home. As she was approaching her back door, she was attacked a black female who apparently had followed her home. The woman took her purse and fled to a nearby car. A partial plate was acquired. The investigation will continue.

05/08 Police observed a man staggering along Fairport Road. He walked out into traffic in front of several cars, and was almost struck. As the officer was arresting the man for Disorderly conduct, he observed him in the back seat of his patrol car with his eyes rolled back in his head. An ambulance was dispatched to the scene.

05/09 A woman who works in a store on West Commercial Street left her purse under the counter. Upon leaving that evening, her purse was gone. Many customers were in the store during the day. No witnesses.

05/10 An employee at a West Commercial Street business reported that he left his personal vehicle at work, and took a work truck home at the end of the day. Upon arriving at work the next morning, his personal vehicle had been taken.

05/12 An East Chestnut Street business reported that someone spray painted graffiti on the side of his building.

05/14 A West Commercial Street business reported that someone stole his identity and charged 10,000.00 worth of merchandise on the internet.

05/12 Country Club Liquor reported that a man and two women walked into the store and removed three bottles of VSOP Cognac from the shelves. They then walked out without paying. Video surveillance has photos of them, and the investigation continues.

05/14 A Drumore Crescent woman was arrested for Excessive Noise after she continually yelled at the passing children from her window. The parents complained that she also yelled obscenities at them. She was issued an appearance ticket.

05/15 An East Maple avenue resident reported that someone broke her rear car window with a rock. No suspects or witnesses.

05/16 East Rochester Police and Fire responded to a small fire on the Railroad tracks. The fire was extinguished and CSX responded to determine if the tracks could be opened.

05/17 Police observed a vehicle swerving across the lanes of Fairport Road. The driver was intoxicated and was charged with DWI, Speeding, Moving from Lane unsafely, and refusing to take a Breathalyzer test.

05/17 A Domestic incident resulted in a Garfield Avenue man being arrested for Harassment 2nd, and Unlawful Possession of Marijuana, when he pushed his girlfriend around, causing bruising to her arms.

05/20 A domestic dispute between a Father and son turned violent and resulted in th3e son being arrested for Assault 3rd, and Criminal Mischief. The suspect threw the Television on the floor smashing it and punched and bit his father. He was taken to the Monroe County Jail.

05/22 A West Commercial Street resident was arrested after it was reported that he was yelling obscenities pout of his window, and smashing things in his apartment. Police responded and asked the man to quiet down, but he followed the officers out to their cars screaming obscenities at them. He was charged with a violation of the village Noise Ordinance, and Disorderly Conduct.

05/22 Three people were arrested for Trespass after being seen walking in the middle of the railroad tracks. All were issued appearance tickets to East Rochester Court.

05/23 An East Rochester resident turned himself in on Endangering the Welfare of a child charges, after he beat his 8 year old son with a belt. He was also charged with Assault 3rd.

05/24 A Webster resident was charged with a Violation of the Noise Ordinance for having a loud car stereo.

05/25 A West Commercial business reported that two women and a man entered the store; the man distracted the clerk, while the woman removed several gold bracelets and walked out.

05/26 While shopping in a store at Country Club Plaza, a woman realized her purse was missing from her cart. The purse was located after a search in another part of the store. There was \$40.00 missing, but the rest of her contents were intact.

05/28 A Domestic dispute on Pine Street resulted in the arrests of both parties. They both were arrested for Harassment 2nd, and issued appearance tickets.

05/28 A West Chestnut Street teenager left her backpack on the front steps of her home unattended for a few minutes. When she returned the backpack was gone. No witnesses.

05/31 A West Filbert Street residence was damaged by a youth throwing bricks at the picture window. The youth has mental problems and was transported to the hospital.

There were 1,028 calls in the Month of May. Police backed up the Fire Department on 19 calls and the Ambulance Department on 48 calls. 147 traffic tickets were issued, and 5 DWI arrests were made. The police did a special DWI Traffic detail on May 27th that yielded 3 intoxicated driving arrests. A special seat belt detail yielded 14 traffic tickets.
