Village Board Report June 2014

Village Board Members,

The East Rochester Fire Department took the lead on coordinating a multi-agency DWI/Distracted Driver simulated drill at the ER High School. On May 2nd a target audience of 11&12 graders watched on as emergency crew's extricated patients from crashed vehicles and provided emergency medical care to injured actors. Our objective was to illustrate the dangers and consequences of driving drunk and/or operating a motor vehicle while being distracted. Many hours went into the planning and preparation for this drill. I would like to thank all the agencies involved including the school district that made this drill such a success. A special thanks to my Deputy Chief, Matt Parrone for his hours of commitment to making this drill come to a reality. Our goal is to continue building this program and present it every other year to the juniors and seniors.

The FD responded to (3) structure fires in the month of May. Two of the fires involved front porches that were contained within the porch areas and never extended into the residences. Had it not been for the passersby's that noticed these fires and called 911 immediately, the outcomes could have been tragic. As you all know on Memorial Day we responded to the Despatch Junction for a building fire. Our first arriving units encountered heavy fire and smoke from the west end of the building. With-in seven minutes of being on-scene, the fire had rapidly spread to the rest of the building. I would like to commend the men of the ERFD on a job well done as they sacrificed time away from their families. They battled this fire for hours without hesitation in an attempt to prevent the loss of such a great landmark in our community. We had crews at the scene for over 17 hours. The ERFD had assistance from (9) different departments and more than 40 additional firefighters, throughout the incident. I'm happy to report that we had no major issues or injuries as a result of this fire.

The ERFD responded to (48) incidents in the month of May, (8) of which were mutual aid to our neighboring departments.


