Regular and Special Programming:

Children's – Babies' Fun Time meet four times, with 59 participants. Two Outreach Story Times, which were conducted at two local Day Care Centers, had 22 people in attendance. Drop-In Story Time for ages 2-4 had 39 participants, and Story-Time for ages 5-7 had 48 attending. Five outreach Kindergarten visits were conducted at the East Rochester Public Schools, and 87 children attended the programs which included stories and discussion of first library cards.

Adult's –The adult's Reading Discussion Group met on May 20th, and discussed Olive Kitteridge by Elizabeth Strout. Nine people attended this lively discussion. The next meeting is at seven p.m. June 17th. All are welcome to attend this vibrant and fun group.

Pat and I attended a mandatory Conference facilitated by Foodlink on May 24th, from 2:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m..

There were 3 other such meetings in the past 2 months. This one was held at the former Pepsi Warehouse on Joseph Avenue in Rochester. This facility has been donated to Foodlink and is being prepared for Foodlink's operations, food preparations, and warehouse. They have outgrown their second facility on Exchange St.. These meetings are held to update those of us who run Food Pantries throughout Western New York, by giving us materials and guidelines on sell-by dates, expiration dates, and spotting canned goods that are potentially dangerous. Much of these are handed down to us by our State Dept. of Agriculture. Our attendance at this meeting would confirm our eligibility to continue to receive the NYS

HPNAP (Hunger Prevention & Nutrition Assistance Program) grant, and the government food purchase grant, which pays for 95 % of all the foods we receive from Foodlink. The time spent at these meetings are certainly well worth the rewards.
