

We responded to the scene of (3) separate house fires in the Fairport and Pittsford Fire Districts. The 3rd Battalion has a great reputation in the county for strong seamless interagency coordination. This month demonstrated just that. The 3rd Battalion relies greatly on mutual aid companies and continues to build collectively in training and at incidents to be ready to assist each other in the time of need.

Summer parade season is upon us and our department is participating in several firemen's parades around the area again this year. The ERFD took several prizes at both the Mendon and Barnard Parades last month.

The East Rochester Fireman's Field Days are weeks away. Our famous chicken barbecue starts of the week on Wednesday 7/22 at 4pm-till, at the fire house. Starting Thursday – Saturday there will be live music, midway rides, food, beer tent and games of chance each night. Pay one price ride specials Thursday & Friday 6pm-10pm and Saturday 12pm-4pm. Did You Know? Summer Reading is in full swing in the months of July and August. Join us for regularly scheduled programs, as well as many special programs for children and teens.

Regular and Special Programming:




