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

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### **Village Board Report August 2015**

Village Board Members,

I would like to start off by thanking the community and our visitors who attended this year's fireman's field days. From the sold out chicken barbecue, to the entertainment, food, beverages and rides, to the fireman's parade, this year was another successful event. A special thanks to Mother Nature for her cooperation all week. As you know our annual field days is our largest and most important fundraiser of the year. Our department relies heavily on a successful event to offset operational expenses throughout the fiscal year. Without the support from the community including the many fire departments across Monroe and the surrounding counties, this event wouldn't be successful. Thank you again on behalf of the field days committee and the members of the ERFD.

The FD responded to the school complex for a man trapped under an excavator, inside the school. Upon arrival we found a male with his leg pinned between the machine and trac. The man was extricated free with the use of our new Edraulic battery operated Hurst tool and suffered minor injuries.

During the week of our field days we responded to a call for a 12 year old child unconscious and not breathing. Our members were the first emergency responder's on-scene. Upon arrival, it was confirmed that she had no pulse and CPR was initiated. A short time later with the assistance of an SEQ Tech the child regained a pulse. The child was transported to strong and arrived with a strong pulse and was breathing on her own. Unfortunately, due to complications the child past away two weeks later. I would just like to point out that although the outcome was tragic, it's because of the (4) firefighters that responded quickly and initiated CPR that gave this young girl a fighting second chance. Three of those firefighters who worked on this young girl have young children of their own and as you could imagine how much it hit home for them. This is another example of the 1<sup>st</sup> class service we bring to the community and districts we serve.

The East Rochester Fire Department responded to (30) incidents in the month of July.

**Did You Know?** The Library will be hosting an Ice Cream Social on August 14<sup>th</sup> for all ages to celebrate the end of Summer Reading. Congratulations to all our Summer Readers!

### **Regular and Special Programming:**

**Children's** – Babies' Story Time met 2 times with 25 in attendance. Pre-K Story Time met 5 times with 101 in attendance, and Crafty Kids Story Time met 2 times with 27 in attendance.

**Children's Special Programming-** An evening with Magic Joe at the Library had 25 in attendance, H2O Hero water program had 5 in attendance, a Nature Craft had 16 in attendance, Chris Pallace's superhero drawing program had 20 in attendance, Baby Sign Language had 6 in attendance, a special "Spinning Tops" program had 20 in attendance, and a Superhero Party had 9 in attendance. An Outreach Story Time had 28 in attendance.

**Young Adult-** Five teen volunteers worked 36 hours to help with the Children's Programs this month.

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

**ERCN TV-12 report for the months of June and July 2015:**

**News:**

The volunteers for TV-12 have been very busy with day to day production, scheduling and archiving. Dave Conley has finished this year's Sing-Out and it will begin airing in August. It took over 50 hours to edit. ERCN also covered the Memorial Day and the Daryl Pierson memorial walkway dedication ceremonies in June and the Fireman's Parade in July. Ralph Morabito has begun a new season of One On One interviews which will also begin airing shortly. We also helped Pittsford produce three new "Pittsford Personalities" programs with Town historian Audrey Johnson.

**Programming:**

For the months of June/July, 26 new programs were produced and aired, accounting for 140 volunteer hours. Another 40 volunteer hours were devoted to program scheduling, archiving and station improvements. TV-12 Web streaming had 190 unique viewers logging on to watch streaming or video-on-demand a total of 740 times. Most popular on-demand shows this month were the "Pittsford Personalities" series, Ralph Morabito's One On One series, The Eyer Building Tour with Marty D'Ambrose and ERHS Alumni Field Hockey Games.

ERCN is funded through a portion of Time Warner franchise fees received by the Town/Village of East Rochester along with contributing funds by Fairport and Pittsford. The 29 volunteers of TV-12 proudly serve East Rochester and our neighboring communities of Pittsford, Fairport and Perinton.


