
1. He dispelled the rumors that the Fairport Rd. Wegmans is closing and that Excellus is moving from Techniplex. Both are rumors, not fact.



- In addition to our own alarms, we responded mutual aid with an engine and a ladder truck to a structure fire on Whitney Rd with the Fairport Fire Department on August 26<sup>th</sup>.
- I am pleased to announce that we had three members graduate from the Firefighter-1 (basic fire academy) on August 13<sup>th</sup>. Those members are; Matt Ferris, Tom Smith and Michael Townley.
- With the start of the school year, I would like to remind all village residents to exercise caution when traveling around the village and in the school zones. I would also like to remind everyone to please keep the fire lanes clear at the schools in case of any emergencies that may arise.
- I would like to remind everyone that National Fire Prevention week will begin on Sunday October 6<sup>th</sup> and run through Saturday October 12<sup>th</sup>. #### **Regular and Special Programming:**

**Children's** – Babies' Storytime met 1 time this month, with 6 in attendance. The Pre-K Story Time met 2 times with 22 in attendance, and the Crafty Kids Storytime met 2 times with 24 in attendance.

**Special Programming Babies, Children, And Young Adult-** Baby Sign Language had 20 in attendance, the Crafty Kids Bingo Party had 40 in attendance, Rochester Museum and Science Center Program had 11 in attendance, and the Ice Cream Social had 63 in attendance. Teen Henna Body Art had 11 in attendance.


