Village Board Members,

I'm pleased to inform you that four of our members will be awarded the Monroe County EMS Life Saving Award at the annual Joint Leadership dinner on October 8th. Deputy Chief Parrone, Asst. Chief Herko, Lt. Diego and FF Schenck will be recognized for their efforts in reviving a 12 year old female in August. Lt. Diego will also be recognized for his efforts in reviving a 14 year old boy while working security for the Webster School District. As I've mentioned in the past, our members are great at what they do and this is another example of how they go above and beyond to serve the community.

August was an unusually busy month for the ERFD. The FD responded to (11) motor vehicle accidents including a serious roll over on 31F and a child struck on W. Commercial St. The FD assisted at a working fire in the Penfield trailer parks, as well as responded to the City of Rochester Truck 4's quarters on University Avenue, while they fought a 4 alarm fire at the Buckingham Commons.

We have (5) member's that will be starting the in house new member training early this month. Upon successful completion of our course these members will be cleared as front line firefighters. These members will then move on in early January and attend the Firefighter 1 program at the Public Safety Training Facility (PSTF).

The East Rochester Fire Department responded to (39) incidents in the month of August, (5) of which were to our neighboring departments.

Regular and Special Programming:

Children's – Babies' Story Time met 1 time with 7 in attendance. Pre-K Story Time met 1 time with 12 in attendance, and Crafty Kids Story Time met 1 times with 14 in attendance.
