East Rochester Fire Department Monthly Village Board Report

October 2012

Village Board Members,

I am pleased to report the following activity for the East Rochester Fire Department during the month of September and activities scheduled for October;

- We answered (33) alarms for the month of September. Our year-to-date alarm total is (300).
- In addition to our own alarms, we provided equipment and manpower for (3) mutual aid calls to the Brighton Fire Department, Pittsford Fire Department and Fairport Fire Department.
- I would like to remind all residents that Fire Prevention week begins on Sunday October 7th and runs through Saturday October 13th. Even though Fire Prevention is nationally recognized during a week in October, I strongly encourage everyone to keep fire prevention practices and education in their minds all year long. This can begin with simply installing smoke detectors throughout your home and making sure the batteries are replaced twice a year. This is one of many steps to take to make sure you and your families are safe.
- We have a very busy month of October with our own Fire Prevention programs and activities. We have programs scheduled with the ER school district, other private child care facilities throughout the community and the Senior Citizen center. Our Fire Prevention committee has been working hard to make sure this program reaches as many in the community as possible and I thank them for their hard work.
- We are hosting an open house at the Fire Hall on Sunday October 14th from 10:00am to 1:00pm as part of Fire Prevention week. We would like to invite all village residents to stop in, meet your volunteer firefighters and let us help you with your fire prevention plans. We will have our trucks on display as well as some of our equipment. We hope to see you there.
- As always, we thank you for your continued support.

SEPTEMBER 2012

09/01 Two vehicles parked on the 500 block of West Avenue, had their tires slashed by unknown suspects. No suspects or witnesses.

09/03 A West Spruce Street resident reported that someone stole her lawn sprinkler overnight.

09/04 A Magnolia Avenue resident reported that someone stole four bikes from his backyard overnight.

09/04 Some items were removed from a car parked at Panorama Collision overnight. The vehicle was there for repairs.

09/08 Several vehicles on Lincoln Parkway were entered overnight. Several windows were smashed, and the vehicles were gone through for property. No property reported missing.

09/09 While on routine patrol at 2:30 in the morning, an ER officer observed a male wearing a grey hooded sweatshirt with a flashlight going through a trunk of a vehicle on N. Lincoln Rd. The suspect took off running. A search of the area resulted in the officers observing footprints in the dew on the wet grass. Upon following the footsteps they arrived at a residence on Pine Street, with the footprints going to the back door. The officers observed several fishing rods and tackle and a grey hooded sweatshirt in the garage. Upon talking to the parents of the suspects at the residence, several bags of evidence were produced and taken into evidence. Two suspects were charged with Attempted Petit Larceny. The investigation continues to link the rest of the evidence with previous larceny reports that have been filed. More charges are pending.

09/10 ER Police responded to a report of a fight in front of Steve's Tavern on Main Street. Upon arrival officers observed a suspect bleeding from the mouth surrounded by a group of people arguing with him. The witness's stated that he walked into the bar and began to punch a man in the face, because he refused to buy him a drink. The suspect was placed in the back of the patrol car and asked if he wanted immediate medical attention. He refused and continued to escalate threats to the officers and the nearby bystanders. He then began kicking at the inside of the patrol vehicle and kicked out the side window. He was charged with Harassment, and Criminal Mischief 2nd(felony) for the damage to the police car.

09/11 An East Rochester resident was charged with Criminal Possession of Stolen Property, Auto Stripping, and Petit Larceny in addition to the charges stemming from the auto break in on 09/09/12.

09/14 While on routine patrol officers observed a vehicle speeding on Fairport Road. The car was traveling at 63 miles per hour, and crossed the center line several times. The driver was pulled over, and appeared to be intoxicated. She was charged with Speeding, Moving from Lane Unsafely, Felony DWI- due to a previous conviction, and Refusal to Take a Breathalyzer Test.

09/16 An East Rochester resident was charged under the Village Ordinance for Excessive Noise, after she stood in the street screaming at people during the night.

09/16 Police stopped a vehicle for speeding, and it was determined the driver was intoxicated. She was charged with DWI, Aggravated DWI, and Speeding.

09/17 A Bluff Drive business reported that someone had entered one of their vehicles parked behind the business overnight, and attempted to set the vehicle on fire. It is unknown if anything was taken, photos and Tech work were performed. The case is still under investigation.

09/17 A North Lincoln Road resident reported that while he was away during the day someone gained entry to his house by breaking the glass in his rear door. They stole a flat screen Television, and a World War two rifle. Tech work was done on the premise.

09/19 A domestic dispute on East Chestnut Street resulted in a teenager being arrested for two counts of Harassment after pushed and threatened to beat his father and his father's girlfriend.

09/20 An employee of Red apple was arrested for Petit Larceny after being caught on camera putting cash from the register into his pocket.

09/20 Police responded to a report of a fight in progress in front of Despatch Pizza. Several of the parties stated that one of the suspects who had left the scene was carrying a knife and had displayed a gun in his waistband. The suspect with the gun was located, and a knife was found near the scene. The suspect was located further down the street, and confirmed he had a gun, but it was only a bb gun. The suspect is on Parole and was just released from prison. He was charged with Menacing, Criminal Possession of a weapon 3rd, and Criminal Possession of a weapon 4th. He was remanded to jail, and was given no bail on the recommendation of the District Attorney's office.

09/21 Police responded to a West Commercial Street address for a report of a criminal mischief in progress. The victim observed a male suspect that he recognized exit a vehicle and stab both of the tires on his vehicle. The suspect then smashed out the front window of his car with a baseball bat. The victim described the vehicle that fled the scene, and knew where it could be located. The suspect was picked up by East Rochester Police the next day and charged with Criminal Mischief 3rd (a felony). He was arraigned and sent to the Monroe County Jail. The vehicle was impounded , because they officers found a large knife on the floor of the suspect vehicle.

09/23 Two males were observed walking on the street in violation of the curfew. They were 16 years old and were issued appearance tickets to court.

09/24 Police responded to a report of a male smoking Marijuana on the corner of McKinley St. and West Elm street. Upon arrival an off duty police officer had the suspect under arrest. The suspect was charged with Unlawful Possession of Marijuana 5th, Harassment, and Resisting Arrest.

09/26 Piano Works Mall reported graffiti to the west side of their building overnight.

09/28 Police observed a vehicle on Fairport road crossing the double solid line. Upon stopping the vehicle it was observed that the driver appeared to be under the influence of drugs. A subsequent search of the vehicle yielded 5 clear baggies containing cocaine, and a hypodermic needle. The driver was charged with Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance 7th(two counts), and Criminal Possession of a Hypodermic Instrument .

09/30 Police responded to a fight in progress call in Steve's Bar with a man unconscious. The victim regained consciousness and refused prosecution. The suspect had fled the scene. The victim refused to be treated by the ambulance crew.
