East Rochester Volunteer Ambulance Corps, Inc. monthly report for November 2011

- The East Rochester Volunteer Ambulance Corps, Inc. received **79** requests for service in the month of November and answered **57** of them for a **72%** call coverage.
 - Of the calls we responded to **7** were cancelled.
 - ERVAC took 17 calls out of district for our neighbors.
 - ERVAC currently has 31 members on our roster. We have 19 members who are cleared to medic a call, 18 who are cleared to drive a call, of those numbers 14 are able to do both positions. We have 3 members in training, 1 member on medical leave, 2 members are on student leave while attending college, 1 member on an extended work leave out of town, and 3 members who are non running and help where needed.

- We also completed our outdoor firematic training for the season.
- The fire department asks that the residents exercise caution during the holiday season in respect to Christmas decorations. Please pay close attention to circuit loads and extension cords as well as keeping live trees well watered.
- The members of the Fire Department would also remind the residents of the village to help us, help you, by suggesting they adopt a fire hydrant near your house on your street. We ask that you make sure that the hydrants are free of snow. By doing this you are saving us precious time to establish a plentiful flow of water to protect you and your neighbors in the event of a fire.

NOVEMBER 2011

11/01 East Rochester Police responded to a customer trouble at the Red Apple Mini Mart. A customer had used the ATM machine in the amount of \$600.00., but the machine jammed and did not dispense any cash. The customer was upset and refused to leave the store. The vending company came and cleaned out the machine, but refused to issue any money to the customer. The customer had a police report taken and was told to contact her own bank.

11/01 Police responded to a disturbance call on East Linden Avenue. Upon arrival several males were standing in the driveway talking loudly and were told to quiet down. Another male was seen on the side of the house throwing up. The officers were invited into the residence where several under age people were drinking beer. No admitted to providing the alcohol. The renter of the property was charged with Consumption of Alcohol by Minors in a Residence. The male who was throwing up was transported to the hospital for alcohol poisoning.

11/02 Police responded to a fight call on Garfield Street. Two 16 year old females were continuing an argument which started at the high school that day. The aggressor slapped the victim repeatedly on the face, and fled the scene. She was later located and arrested for Assault 3rd.

11/05 A domestic dispute on East Maple Avenue resulted in both parties of a domestic dispute being arrested. Both Parties were charged with Harassment 2nd, and Criminal Contempt 2nd.

11/06 Two youths who had been reported missing by their parents was found while on routine patrol. The youths ran through back yards to escape the officer, but were found and returned home to their parents.

11/07 A sixteen year old was charged with a violation of the Village Ordinance for being in the parks after hours after he was observed in the North side Park after it was closed.

11/07 A seventeen year old female was arrested for being in the North side park after hours, and having Marijuana on her person. She was charged with being in The Parks After hours, and Unlawful Possession of Marijuana.

11/10 An East Rochester resident reported to police that after using her debit card at the A Plus on Washington Street; her bank notified her of suspicious charges. Over \$800.00 was taken from her account from a company in Connecticut. Her card was deactivated and the cash was returned to her account by the Credit Union.

11/12 While on routine Patrol our officer observed a vehicle going down Washington Street at a high rate of speed. The vehicle was stopped and it was determined the driver was intoxicated. She was charged with DWI, and released with an appearance ticket.

11/13 A domestic dispute became violent and both parties were arrested and charged with Harassment. They were issued appearance tickets for court.

11/14 The female in the above dispute returned home and began to rip the walls off the apartment with a crowbar. She was charged with Criminal Mischief 3rd, and an order of Protection was issued to the victim.

11/15 Police responded to a check the welfare on DePaul Drive. A Coworker was concerned because the victim did not show up for work, and had complained about not feeling well. The victim was found deceased in the living room of his house and the Medical Examiner's office responded and pronounced him dead. His next of kin was notified.

11/16 Police responded to a family trouble call on East Elm Street. Upon arrival it was determined that the female was violating an Order of Protection on her husband. She was arrested for Criminal Contempt 2nd, and issued an appearance ticket

11/17 A Fairport resident was arrested for Shoplifting from Wegmans. He was issued an appearance ticket.

11/18 An East Chestnut Street resident reported that when he arrived home at his apartment, the front door was open and someone was leaving by the back door. A search turned up no suspects, and nothing appeared to be taken from the apartment. The door does not latch properly.

11/19 A vehicle repossession turned into an altercation when the vehicles owner tried to drive the car off the repo trucks chains. 911 reported a male with a possible gun in his pocket helping the female. The male was searched and no weapon was found. The car was taken away by the towing company.

11/22 A ladder was reported missing from an Isaac heating truck parked on West Filbert Street. No suspects or witnesses.

11/22 An East Rochester resident reported her wallet missing from when she was shopping at Fairport Road Wegmans. She remembered setting the wallet down somewhere, but it was never turned back in to Wegmans.

11/23 Police responded to the report of a Motor vehicle accident. The car had smashed into a tree on Main Street and the driver was still in the vehicle when police arrived. The officer detected a smell of

alcohol on the driver's breath. He was charged with Aggravated DWI, Reckless Driving and 8 other traffic citations. He was remanded to the County jail on no bail. The vehicle was towed.

11/27 Police responded to a Burglar alarm at a Despatch Drive business. Upon arrival several youths were observed inside of the business. They fled out the back door and ran to the rail road tracks. MCSO canine responded and tracked the suspects as far as the park. A cell phone was reported stolen during the Burglary. Tech work will be performed at the scene.

11/28 A Madison Street resident reported that his outside Christmas lights were cut into several pieces and left on the ground overnight. – No suspects or witnesses.

11/28 A student at the high school reported that his sweatshirt was removed from his locker. Cameras revealed the suspect removing it from the locker. The suspect was interviewed and did return the sweatshirt to its owner. Case closed- no Prosecution.

11/30 Police responded to a custody dispute on Main Street, The father wanted to take both of his sons, but only had the paperwork to remove one of them. He was advised to return to Family court and get the correct paperwork to take both of them for visitation.

The East Rochester police Department responded to 1,047 calls in the month of November. They backed up the Fire Department and Ambulance Corps on 43 calls. There were three more DWI arrests, bring the total so far this year to 36. The winter parking regulations went into effect, and the officers issued over 182 warning tickets over the last two weeks of November to educate the public about the regulations. A new stop sign was put up at the intersection of West Spruce Street and Main Street, in an attempt to slow down traffic in the school zone. Our officer spent time watching the sign, and stopping the vehicles that ran it. One of the officers reported that over the course of one hour- several people ran the stop sign. When they were pulled over none of them were even aware it was there.
