Special Programming included a Sing & Sign Program for the Babies' Fun Time group with 10 in attendance. There was also a "Tail Waggin Tutors" Program for the children, who read stories out loud to dogs, with 8 in attendance.

*Adult's* –The adult's Reading Discussion Group met on November 11th, and discussed The Christmas Train by David Baldacci. Fourteen people attended this lively discussion. The next meeting is at seven p.m. January 20<sup>th</sup>, no December meeting. All are welcome to attend this vibrant and fun group.

NOVEMBER 2010

11/01 A Magnolia Avenue resident reported that the drivers side window of his vehicle was smashed open overnight. Nothing was reported stolen from the vehicle.

11/01 An East Avenue resident reported that her car was egged overnight. No witnesses.

11/01 A West Ivy street resident reported that overnight someone entered his sons bedroom via a basement window and stole his sons Xbox. However it was observed by the investigating officer that the cut in the basement window screen was not large enough to fit a person, and was simply used to put the electronic equipment out of the window. Entry gained though another door left unlocked. Several acquaintances were aware of this. The investigation will continue.

11/03 A West Commercial Street business owner reported the unlawful use of one of the company's gas cards. It has not been determined who is using it or how they obtained it. The investigation will continue with new information.

11/04 A West Filbert Street resident reported her flat screen TV and Xbox were stolen from her apartment while she was out of town. Entry gained through a 2nd floor window from a nearby garage roof. A friend knew the apartment was vacant. The investigation will continue.

11/04 A towing business reported that one of it's customers had property stolen while the vehicle was parked on their property. One of the windows in the vehicle had been previously smashed out.

11/04 Two School children reported to police that they had been approached by a man driving a rusty grey sedan. He pulled along side them and said "Hey! I have Candy!". The children refused to go near the car and the driver sped off. No license plate available. No other witnesses

11/06 The Red Apple on North Washington Street reported a man came into buy beer, and then left with the beer after stating his money was in the car. The vehicle then drove away. Closed Circuit TV will be reviewed for information.

11/07 An East Rochester resident reported her vehicle stolen by her two underage sons. The vehicle was already under investigation for being involved in a hit and run accident earlier in the day. The vehicle was later located, and the mother provided depositions to have her son arrested. They were both charged with Unauthorized Use of A Motor Vehicle 4th, and the Driver was also charged with Criminal Mischief 4th. They were transported to a juvenile detention facility.

11/08 Police were dispatched to a business on Despatch Dr. The victim stated he saw a male going through vehicles. A deputy had stopped the male suspect and ERPD identified him as they had earlier dealings w/ him. After emptying his pockets, he was found to have a large amount of loose change, several packs of cigarettes, an MP3 player and a NYS drivers license that did not belong to the him.

The victim identified the NYS drivers license as his. Due to an outstanding parole violation warrant, suspect was turned over to Monroe County Jail. Property was logged into the ERPD.

11/08 A woman called to report that her vehicle had been broken into and her MP3 player was stolen as well as her dome light in her vehicle had been smashed. Upon investigation, it was determined that the above person that was arrested on the parole warrant was also in possession of this victims MP3 player. The victim went to the PD and positively identified the player as hers and an arrest warrant was requested for when suspect gets out of jail.

11/12 A vehicle that was speeding on Fairport Rd. yielded additional charges including a DWI and an open container for a Rochester male. He also refuse to take the breathalyzer He was issued multiple tickets and release with a court date.

11/13 An East Rochester juvenile was observed on N. Lincoln Road Jumping from one parked vehicle roof to another. The damage to one of the vehicles was over \$800.00. The parents of the youth were notified they would be held responsible for the damage.

11/13 An officer observed a vehicle going past him on Main Street with a loud car stereo. Upon pulling the vehicle over the officer observed drugs on the front seat of the car. The drugs tested positive for marijuana. The car was searched and the officer discovered a Billy club under the drivers seat, and a gravity knife in the glove box. He was charged with Criminal Possession of a Weapon 4th, Unlawful Possession of Marijuana, and a violation of the village noise ordinance.

11/15 An E. Elm Street man was charged with Disorderly Conduct after he blocked an intersection with a red wagon with all of his possessions in it. He blocked traffic for approximately 10 minutes. He was sent to jail for a mental evaluation.

11/15 A East Rochester man was charged with the Open Container law when he was observed walking down W. Elm Street with a container of Four Loco in his hand. He was issued an appearance ticket.

11/16 A resident of W. Chestnut Street reported that his car was keyed overnight. The drivers side of the vehicle was scratched.

11/17 East Rochester Police, with the assistance of GRANET, arrested a Main Street resident For Criminal Possession of Marijuana, and Criminal Possession of a weapon.. He was remanded to the Monroe County Jail.

11/19 A Roosevelt Road resident retorted some one entered his bedroom window and stole a lap top computer and a Play Station 3. The window was unlocked because he had just removed his air conditioning unit from the window.

11/20 An East Rochester resident was arrested for Criminal Possession of Marijuana after he tried to use a counterfeit \$10.00 bill at a Commercial Street store.

11/20 A West Hickory Street resident reported a statue of a marine in dress uniform was removed from his front yard.

11/23 An East Rochester man was arrested for Criminal Contempt 2nd after he violated an order of Protection against is ex-wife.

11/25 A Fairport resident was arrested for DWI after being stopped for speeding on Washington Street.

11/27 A West Elm Street resident reported her front picture window damaged by several bb holes, when she returned home from work. No witnesses.

11/28 A Macedon resident reported that the rear window of his vehicle was damaged by unknown means after he went under the Washington Street underpass. He did not see anyone around.

11/30 A Medina resident was arrested for Aggravated Unlicensed Operator of a motor vehicle after he was stopped as a suspicious vehicle. He had two underage females with him in the car that he had given alcohol to in Medina. Further charges are pending there.

**The East Rochester Police responded to 1,135 calls in the Month of November. The winter parking regulations took effect on November 15th and 141 warning tickets were issued for the first week. There were 64 parking tickets issued for illegal overnight parking after that. The Police Department assisted on 30 Ambulance calls and 11 Fire calls. The Chief of Police wants to remind all of our residents that if you are going away for the holidays, please call the Police Department so they can give your vacant property a special check every day. When you call, please have the names and phone numbers of anyone who will have access to your property and information of how to reach you while you are away.**

## **East Rochester Volunteer Ambulance Corps, Inc. monthly report for November 2010**

- The East Rochester Volunteer Ambulance Corps, Inc. received 79 requests for service in the month of November and answered 45 of them for a 57% call coverage. Of the calls responded to 16 were transported to the hospital, 15 were cancelled.
- we took 7 calls out of district for our neighbors.
- we currently have 36 members on our roster. We have 24 members who are cleared to medic a call, 22 who are cleared to drive a call, of those numbers 17 are able to do both positions. We have 3 members in training. We have 4 members who are non running and help where needed.
- we are in need of volunteers on all shifts, especially days and overnights. Anyone interested in volunteering their time should contact the East Rochester Ambulance Corps. At 586-5723.
